SUDBURO, Ont., March 6-That the French-speaking citizens of New Ontario are up in arms against the recent provincial regulations in regard to bi-lingual schools, was made evident by a convention of more than 200 delegates here. It was the first convention yet held in the province to consider the situation and had delegates from as far north as Cochrane, and westerly to Sault Ste Marie. A large proportion was composed of the clergy. The general features of the regulations issued by the education department were discussed fully, and the sense of the meeting was finally embodied in a series of resolutions, which will be forwarded to the French-Canadian educational association at Ottawa for future action. It is the purpose of the French-Canadian citizens of Ontario to hold meetings at other points of the province and the opinions thus obtained will be carefully gone into, with the view to their unification.

ANOTHER EFFORT TO SECURE FREEDOM. NEW YORK, March 6-Harry K. Thaw, slayer of Stanford White, was brought down to New York from Mattewan today and appeared in the Supreme Court, prepared to fight for his release on a writ of habeas corpus, a proceeding in which he has been defeated on several previous occasions. He was represented by Dr. Charles Kennedy, a lawyer-physician.

BANK RUN ONLY A JOKE.

MONTREAL, March 5-An April-fool joke twenty-five days ahead of time. Such is the comment of the City and District Savings bank officials in referring to the run, which after keeping up for two days with vigor, showed signs of subsiding to-night. The bank met all demands made without asking other banks for assistance and President Orient stated tonight that the institution was in such a strong position financially that it could meet all future calls.

This afternoon saw a cessation of the run at several of the branches. This evening business was about normal in most of the branches. The two days' rush has served to show in striking manner the strength of the institution as, in that period no less than \$2,800,000 in cash, was sent out from the head office to the various city branches. The officials could not ascertain tonight just exactly how much of this amount had been paid out to depositors in the course of the day, as the branch statements had not been received. Moreover, reports received from different quarters of the city were to the effect that deposits, owing to restored confidence had mounted up to a considerable figure, this being noticeable particularly in the head office.
