CRATER FALLS IN ON VESUVIUS

SURVIVORS OF SOVINTO TELL STORY OF WRECK

Five Members of The Crew In City En Route to Chatham—Almost Recovered From Their Recent Experience—Men of The Government Steamers Make Address and Presentation

They arrived in this city Saturday evening, from Souris, five of the survivors of the crew of the wrecked ship Sovinto. Their names are Oscar Rydér, John Olsen, Herman Pettersson, Ole Olsen, and Arthur Gjervig.

On Wednesday morning, seeing that the people on the shore had no life saving appliances and could render no assistance the captain of the Sovinto determined to launch the only lifeboat remaining. All through the night these men had clung to the wreck and the seas had washed over them continuously.

This morning they leave for Chatham. Asked if they had now had enough of a sailor's life, they all laughed and philosophically agreed that their late experience was only part of the "day's work."
