ONE of the LAST ACTS of a GREAT LIFE

His Excellency, the late Right Honourable Lord Tweedsmuir, Baron of Elsfield, P.C., G.C.M.G., C.H., Governor-General of Canada, was until his widely-mourning passing on Sunday, February 11th, Honorary President and Patron of the Salvation Army National Advisory Board.



On January 26th, only sixteen days before his unexpected and untimely death, he wrote the letter reproduced below, warmly commending the work of the Salvation Army for the soldiers. The writing of this letter was thus one of the last acts of a noble life consecrated to duty, achievement and patriotic service.

GOVERNMENT HOUSE, OTTAWA

As Honorary President of the National Advisory Board, I should like to draw the attention of the public to the War Service Work of the Salvation Army.

Whether our sailors and soldiers and airmen are engaged in actual fighting or in training, time will often hang heavily on their hands. It is for organizations such as the Salvation Army to provide opportunities for recreation and refreshments of the mind in these long periods of enforced inactivity.

The Salvation Army with its high ideals, its long practical experience and its magnificent record of service is highly competent to take part in this important work and I warmly commend its efforts to all those who have the welfare of our fighting services at heart.
