Y.M.C.A. ROAD RACE THANKS GIVING DAY.—Word has just been received from "Doc" Dawson, Physical Director of the Halifax Y. M. C. A. that the Dunlop Tire and Rubber Goods Co., Ltd. have presented four beautiful shields to the Y.M.C.A. Athletic League of Canada, to be used as team prizes in "Five Mile Road Races." One of these is for the Maritime Provinces and is now on exhibition in Halifax. Its eight million people were up to the ears in the struggle, about half a million of our brave sons fighting for the peace of the world, while only in the dying hours of war did a small contingent of U. S. soldiers tasted the horrors of conflict. He says "We sold more Victory Bonds than the war cost us." He knows apparently less about the cost of the war or the sale of Victory Bonds than the man in the moon. If he knew anything he would have sense enough to see that the payment of the 6 per cent of our war debt was from ordinary revenue, and that payment by proceeds from bond issues would not be a debt reduction. Not one dollar of Victory Bond money can be appropriated to any other purpose, and in point of fact it has not been, notwithstanding the absolutely false impressions which this wholesale slanderer is endeavoring to leave upon the minds of our honest and law abiding people. Of the Victory bonds sold it must not be forgotten that \$300,000,000 to \$400,000,000 was to purchase supplies for the British Government which are due and will be returned to us. But this agitator apparently does not know the difference between a war debt and a war loan, or if he does he prefers to deny and falsify facts concerning his country to telling the plain and simple truth.
