Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 36, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, in the event of one-quarter section of 100 acres, more or less. Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated. Entries must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated. The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased of the homesteader, resides upon a town in the vicinity of the land entered for the homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands in Ottawa of intention to apply for patent. W. W. COOK, Deputy of the Minister of the Interior. N. M. G. HANEY GETS THE CONTRACT

MONTREAL, July 21.—It is said that Mr. M. G. Haney has secured the contract for building the Michigan Central Tunnel under the Detroit River, between Windsor and Detroit. A number of plans and tenders were submitted, but Mr. Haney's prevailed, and the length of the tunnel including approaches will be about two miles. The work will be composed of concrete sections which are to rest on piles, and the connection to be made by means of compressed air.
