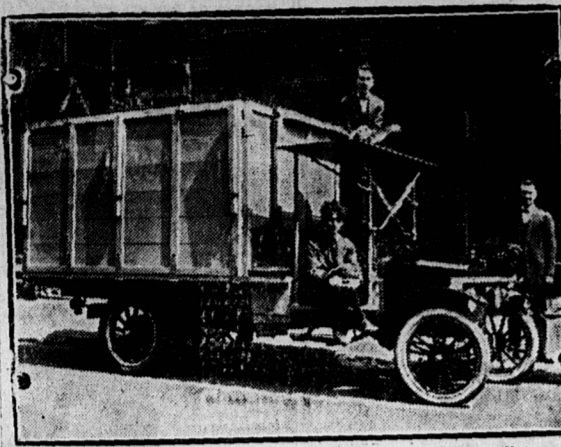

BRITISH COMMANDER WRITES IN PARIS OF AMERICAN TROOPS

BOSTON, June 25.—The saga of the first volunteer troops of the United States to arrive at the front in France—a regiment of engineers recruited from the peration staffs of the New England railroads—has just been written. It is entitled "A History of the 14th Engineers, United States Army, from May, 1917, to May, 1919," and dedicated "To the memory of those members of the regiment who died in France." Incorporated in the volume is a tribute to these 1,200 railway men of New England by General Aylmer Haldane, who commanded the British Corps while the 14th Engineers were attached to that body from August, 1917, to May, 1918. The British referred to their men affectionately as "The 14th American R. E.'s (Royal Engineers)." "At the time the 14th Engineers were under my command our duty to recognize earlier the need for light railways as being required, but the means necessary to operate as lacking," General Haldane writes. "The arrival, however, of our comrades from across the Atlantic speedily changed the aspect of affairs in this respect, and in many directions trains were carrying supplies and materials from the railheads at obscurus-an-mont to the vicinity of the forward trenches." At this critical moment they had that, while they could operate always with all the skill required, they could as readily handle a rifle and share in the reater dangers on the firing line. can vividly recall my chief engineer, Brigadier-General Harvey, pointing to me how stubbornly the 14th Engineers had taken part with the British infantry in elping to stem the onrush of the German troops, and my pride in aving those gallant New Englanders under my command." The regiment included two companies from the Boston and Maine Railroad and other smaller New England lines; two from the New York, New Haven and Hartford, and one each from the Maine Central and Boston and Albany. The lieutenant colonel was Albyan T. Perkins, a railroad executive from the middle West, and the battalion commanders major B. W. Guppy, bridge engineer of the Boston and Maine, and major D. S. Brigham, then trainmaster of the Boston and Albany.

Comedians and Shakespeare

(By Dominion News Service) LONDON, June 25.—According to Max Reinhardt, the famous theatrical producer England is missing her greatest opportunities in the production of Shakespearean plays. "No wonder Shakespeare cannot be made to pay in the West End theatres," he exclaimed. "You have the finest comedians in the world. Comedians are England's specialty, but you restrict them to your Music Halls and your reviews. Why don't your great hearts open up a season of Shakespearean comedies with men like Billy Merson, Harry Tate, George Robey, Alfred Lester, and Leslie Henson, playing the comedy parts. You would fill your theatres and because these comedians are in contact with the reactions and the minds of the modern audience they would be able to make Shakespeare live far more vividly than can the classically actors with their traditional methods. One of the reasons for my visit to England is to make a thorough study of the English comedian. "If I had only time to spend here I would love to see all my old friends, especially the English playwrights who are so popular in Germany and Austria, like Bernard Shaw, who is the dominant figure on the German stage, Galsworthy, Chesterton, and Arnold Bennett." Mr. Reinhardt, who is now living in his Castle at Salzburg, is returning to America in the autumn to produce four plays, one of them being "The Miracle" which he originated in London twelve years ago.
