

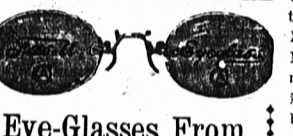

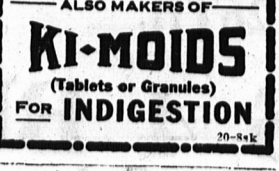

Sir Frederick Orr-Lewis Dead

MONTREAL, Nov. 21.—Sir Frederick Orr Lewis, Bart., of residence in the south of France, according to cable news received here last night. He was in his sixty-second year and had been in failing health for some time, never having recovered from his illness when, as a passenger on the Lusitania, he was picked up after some hours' immersion in the sea, following the torpedoing of that vessel by the Germans in May, 1915.

Sir Frederick was born in Hamilton, Ont., in 1851 and in 1909 founded the Canadian Vickers Limited, of which he was the president at his death. A baronetcy was conferred on him on January, 1920, in recognition of special war services, particularly in connection with his shipbuilding activities.

much dissatisfaction in the Liberal ranks today. There is already a movement on foot to form a new party under the leadership of Sir Louis Gouin, also a possibility of the Liberals being absorbed by the Progressives under Mr. Crerar. Progressives has a large number of disgruntled Liberals running as his favorite candidates. It is a common remark today to hear it said: "the old Liberal party is dead"; "is shot to pieces"; "is without a leader"; "no policy," etc.

Mr. Wright-of-cowhide-faint-the Farmers' candidate, now campaigning in Prince Co., when making a speech in this city a few weeks ago gave the impression that Mr. Crerar's platform was not altogether complete, presumably not quite safe, as a few planks had been stolen from it by the Liberal party evidently to supply the "missing links" in the MacKenzie King platform, which, like its leader is "not a complete platform." Our local Liberal candidates have failed to reveal it and it must be in safe keeping somewhere. Mr. Myers and Mr. Donald McKinnon have been hunting it for some weeks with little success and relying on the old saying: "if you beat the bushes hard enough you will find the hidden birds," but I am afraid if they depend on finding these (King) Birds in time for their smug dinner it would be as well to depend too much on the Liberal candidates as it has been whispered around enough to be loaned to the farmer candidate in Prince County (Mr. Wright) in return for the stolen planks. It is an ill bird that befools its own nest and this is what the Liberal candidates have been continually preaching to their voters. They will tell you they do not care for much of our industries are dismantled if only they can arrange power tariffs with the Yankees to buy their goods in return for access to their larger markets, etc. It would certainly be a sorry condition for our country if their own markets become secondary to those of a foreign country. It is evidence of decay. This is on a par with what Mr. Crerar told his Theatre in the Prince Edward those few brick and mortar walls he would destroy if only to secure a cheaper ginham dress for his housekeeper. I wonder what the labor men thought of such doctrine. Is it not factories and employment that our labor men care about? So much for our "protection" regarding the policy of Protection under which the United States had prospered he replied: "Oh, the United States has the greatest Free Trade area in the world" Like nonsense! It would be like telling a farmer that your policy today is "Free Trade" and "Protection" and when pressed for an answer, reply: "Oh, you ship your potatoes and other products to Montreal and Toronto and you pay no duty." It would be very difficult to convince a man like Mr. Crerar that he is wrong, as in this respect he is not unlike Mr. King in his treatment of the Tariff problem. Certain class yet it is such doctrine as has been preached by Mr. King that has caused so many defections from the good old Liberal party. Witness the revolt in the Province of Quebec, where there are some 20 to 25 Liberal Independent or Farmer Protectionists in the field and stating publicly they cannot follow McKinnon in his vacillating statements on the Tariff issue nor under any circumstances will they have anything to do with Mr. Crerar, whom they look upon as their worst enemy. They are not surprised that Mr. Crerar should succeed in getting a following in the West, where there is a large mixture of foreign population who would just as soon trade in foreign markets as in our own, besides, it is well to remember that upwards of half a million immigrated principally farmers from the western United States, came into Canada during the four years previous to the war and we must not wonder that these people have a desire to still trade with the United States, and when Mr. Crerar's was first first, Mr. Wood, the ex-Missouri farmer, appeal to these same people to support them in having closer trade relations with their old friends the Yankees, you should not be surprised at their willingness to support the "Wheat King" of the West (not weak King) in an effort to secure legislation to benefit the wealthy wheat growers of Western Canada may im-

BOILED SHIRTS APPEAR AGAIN AT MOSCOW
MOSCOW, Nov. 21.—Boiled shirts made their reappearance here at the opening performance of grand opera. There were seven of them and not one was the sort that one but he will do well to leave this scrub with a sponge. This extremely bourgeois attire was an announcement that starch has arrived in the Moscow markets with the changed economic policy.
The entire audience in the great opera house breathed their advent of a new era in Russia. Seats were sold in the old time way. The mammoth auditorium is just as brilliant in its dull gold and red interior as it was in the days of the Czar. There was a marked difference between the opera crowd this year and that of three years ago. In the opening months of the Soviet regime Bolsheviks of both sexes nearly all wore black leather coats which they dramatized very heavily at the opera and in all public places. The absorption of a large foreign population and three years of experience in government have changed the dominant party. The members have softened and become more conventional.
