HARNESSED NIAGARA.

For thousands of years the cataract of Niagara thundered in the trackless solitudes of an uninhabited country, or was gazed upon in wonder by Indian savages. With the coming of the white man came the admiration of the pioneer settlers and afterward of the thousands of tourist visitors, some of whom made long journeys by steamer and railway in order to gaze upon the thrilling and majestic spectacle which it presented. Now, in the light of this utilitarian age those long past epochs are looked upon as periods of most stupendous waste. Men of science have said that Niagara shall no longer exist for mere spectacular effect, nor shall the waters of half a continent be permitted to idly tumble over the great precipice, and they have proceeded to harness the giant cataract.

It is in the development of electrical power that the great force of falling water is being turned to account. The first essay was by an American Company to utilize 50,000 horse power. Then a second shaft was completed and under the high pressure of water applied to machinery by the use of turbine wheels gave forth 100,000 horse power additional. Power on the Canadian side is also being developed and by next midsummer 50,000 horse power will be available. Already the company in charge of this work has met with so many demands that before their original scheme has been completed they have decided to increase their works to 110,000 horse power. Another company on the Ontario side have secured rights and are developing 50,000 horse power, which it is intended to increase to 150,000 horse power in the near future. So far the capital for the works on both sides of the river had been American. Still another company, exclusively Canadian, has obtained from the Ontario Government a concession to utilize 100,000 horse power.

Here we have works projected by which the great cataract will at some time in the future in all human probability be giving forth the power of half a million horses by day and by night with tireless energy for industrial uses, as compared with the mere idle tumble and play of its waters in the ages past. Three hundred and fifty thousand horse power is now either in actual use or in progress of development. It is estimated that this when in operation will be worth \$20 per horse power per annum. On this basis the force to be utilised will be worth \$7,000,000 a year. But where will the development stop? With half a million horsepower already in the hands of the capitalist and the inventor, it is easy to see that there will be increasing demands until the cataract itself has disappeared from the landscape while its waters in secret chambers beneath the rock shall perform the work of a million giants in whirling the swift turbines that drive the great dynamos which furnish power over large areas in both the Dominion and the Republic.

The multiplying industries of the world demand ever increasing power. This may be supplied by steam engines, burning coal, but the cost is great. With a great waterfall the cost of power is limited to the outlay for the appliances necessary to make it effective. Nature says to the Canadian and American people, "I give you at Niagara the power of a million horses. You have but to find the harness." And the gift will yet be worth probably twenty million dollars a year. So great and so cheap a power must needs cause a very great industrial development in and around the great cataract. Already it has given to the two nations

THE PORTABLE WIRELESS.

The wizard Marconi has given out that we may hope for the day when a man may carry with him in his journeys an instrument for receiving wireless messages. The sending instrument is necessarily heavier and not so easily portable. He hopes, however, to so obviate this that wireless messages may be easily exchanged at distances of thirty miles or less by portable instruments of the wireless system. Surprising as this proposal may seem it is really less so than what has been already achieved in the transmission of messages without wires across the broad Atlantic. We dare not set limits to what may yet be accomplished by the agency of electricity, whether in the matter of communication between distant points of the earth's surface, or between the earth and a neighboring planet, provided the latter be, as we suppose inhabited by creatures of equal intelligence and progress with ourselves.
