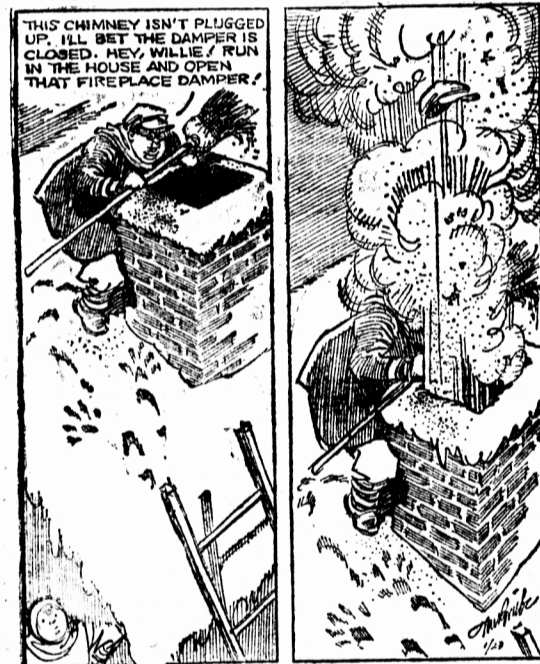

second spade trick. He then started to run off the hearts. On the third heart East avoided trouble by letting go his last spade but the fourth heart forced a decision. After deep thought, East concluded that it was more dangerous to unguard the club suit than the diamond suit, and consequently discarded the diamond three.

This was good defense, since, obviously enough, a club discard by East would have settled the matter, delivering four club tricks to South.

Declarer discarded his low spade on the fourth heart, while West threw off a low club. This sequence of discards from both sides of him convinced the declarer that East had elected himself protector of the club suit, while West engaged to take care of spades and diamonds. South privately questioned West's ability in that respect, and set out to prove his point.

The fifth heart drew another diamond discard from East, and declarer followed that example. West parted with the spade eight. Now South cashed the three top clubs — and West was squeezed. If he surrendered his spade jack, dummy's nine would be good; and when he actually discarded a diamond, the spade was thrown off from dummy, and the three diamonds were good.

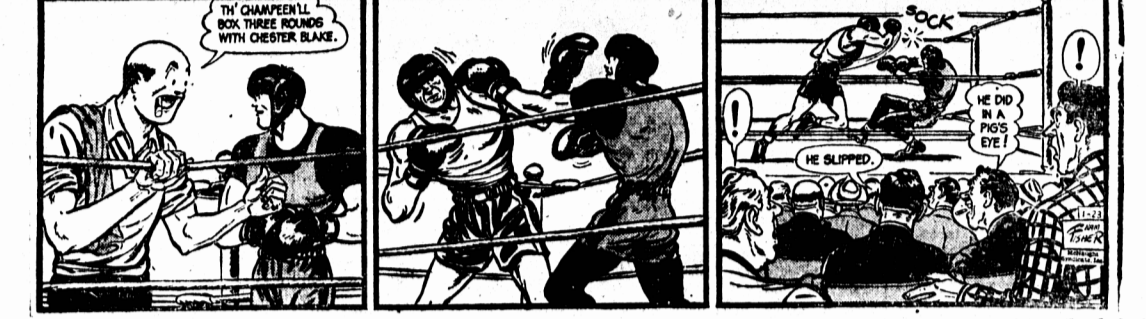

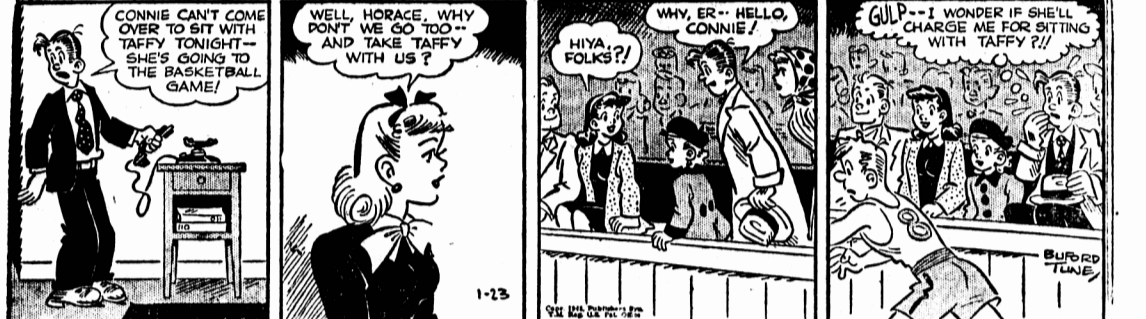

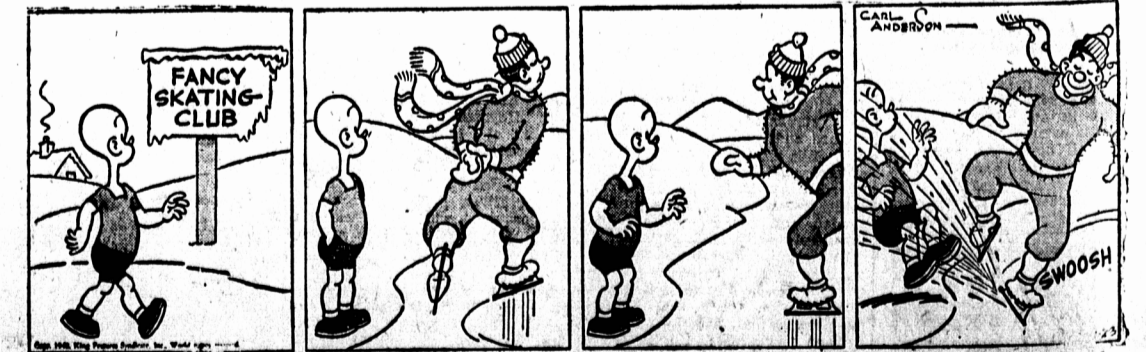
