GATACRE HAD TROUBLES

An Extract From the Earlier Life of British General.

San Francisco, Jan. 29.—The prominence which Gen. Gatacre of the British army has sustained in South Africa revives the story which is now being related among the British residents at Los Angeles, Santa Monica, and other Southern California communities.

When Gen. Gatacre was colonel of the English-Eighth Connaught Rangers he for a time was stationed with his regiment at Dublin. His wife, a beautiful and dashing woman, became very popular in army society till scandal connected her name with that of family and fortune. Col. Gatacre finally called on his wife for an explanation. She is said to have boldly declared her love for the Irish captain, whereupon Col. Gatacre laid down one of two attentives for the captain—either Capt. Murphy must resign his army commission and clear out of the country with Mrs. Gatacre or be killed at once. The captain elected to resign take the lady and clear out.

Col. Gatacre added incidentally that if he ever encountered Murphy on British territory again he would kill him. When next heard of Captain Murphy and the lady were in Los Angeles trying to break into British social set. They had plenty of money, but were steadily ignored by the British residents. Finally they purchased an orange grove near Duarte, where they lived until about a year ago, when Mrs. Gatacre died. Her body was embalmed and sent to England. Capt. Murphy followed soon after and is now married and settled down on his Irish estates. General Gatacre, after his wife and Capt. Murphy left Ireland, exchanged into a regiment for Colonial service, and since then his advancement has been rapid.

Almond Icing For Cakes.

To every pound of finely powdered loaf sugar allow one pound sweet almonds, the whites of four eggs, a little rose water. Blanch the almonds and pound them (a few at a time) in a mortar to a paste, adding a little rose-water to hasten the operation. Whisk the whites of the eggs to a strong froth, mix them with the powdered almonds, stir in sugar and beat altogether. When your cake is sufficiently baked lay on the almond icing and put it in the oven to dry. Before laying this mixture on the cakes, great care must be taken that it is nice and smooth, which is easily accomplished by well beating the mixture.

For Sensitive Hands.

There are some hands which are so sensitive to outside influences that they flush almost like the face, becoming moist with fear or excitement and causing their owners much inconvenience or discomfort. For hands of this description make a wash as follows: A teaspoonful of borax, a teaspoonful of glycerine and a teaspoonful of eau-de-cologne. Mix these ingredients thoroughly together and put into a china pot with a lid. Anoint the hands with the wash after performing the last ablutions of the evening, and allow it to dry as far as possible to dry on. It will render the flesh firm and prevent it from cracking or flushing.
