TROUBLES OF BABINE INDIANS

WINNIPEG, Sept. 8.—'What's the matter with the Babine Indians?' was asked of Father Morice. Father Morice has been in close communication with them all his life, and is here on his way to Quebec to attend the meeting of American scientists interested in anthropological questions.

'The Indians are being moderately wronged,' said Father Morice. 'The entire question is one of the salmon fisheries. The first I heard of trouble was when I received a letter signed by some of the chiefs, the letter being written in the characters which I had taught them. From time immemorial the Babine Indians have subsisted on the salmon taken in Northern British Columbia. In order that sufficient salmon may be secured for a year, it is necessary that the Indians should use the weir, into which the fish enter when ascending or descending a stream. In this manner a large quantity are cured in the sun. With the weir, only enough fish can be secured to supply the needs of the Indians from day to day. Salmon means everything to the Babines. It means more to them than bread and meat to us. Dried salmon is the staple food of Indian life.'

DISCOVERED AN EPSOM SALTS WELL

REGINA, Sept. 8.—A few days ago Dr. Charlton, provincial bacteriologist, showed a sample of water weighing 10 pounds, which had been sent from Mooseomin to be analyzed. This sample was one-fifth epsom salts—a very strong dose for a horse.

The water was taken from a well 45 feet deep on the farm of Mr. Willisroff, north of the Mooseomin, and he has sufficient of the medicinal fluid to supply the whole province. The farmer struck the vein of water and found that it was too bitter to use, and thinking it must be very unusual he sent a 10-pound jug to Dr. Charlton to have it tested.

Mr. Willisroff can start to do business in epsom salts right away, and it is all ready for use.

WESTERN EXHIBITS AT THE GREAT DOMINION FAIR.

The exhibit from the Province of Alberta that is on its way to the Dominion Exhibition at Halifax, extends 30ft. by 30ft. and will thus require a space of 900 square feet. The Saskatchewan exhibit will occupy 500 square feet. To accommodate these, so great is the crush in all departmental offices, the Commission will erect a special structure. These exhibits from the newest Canadian Provinces will prove of exceeding interest. Splendid exhibits are also coming from the West Indies.

The entries for the Horse Races closed on Monday, September 10th, and show that a magnificent field of horses for the Speed Competition will be seen on the fast Exhibition Track.

That everyone in Nova Scotia who wishes to visit the Dominion Exhibition may do so the rates of travel during the two weeks of the Exhibition have been put down to a mere fraction of the ordinary charge. For instance, on Excursion Days a visitor from St. John on the D. A. R., may come to Halifax for \$4.00, and if by the I. C. R. for \$4.75, which also admits to the grounds. If from St. John's, the charge, including admission to the grounds, will be only \$1.25; from Yarmouth and return \$3.00; from Amherst \$1.75; from Truro \$1.15; from Pictou \$1.50 from Antigonish \$2.00. These are given as samples—all other rates are equally low. On days other than the Excursion days of which there will be four on the I. C. R. and four on the D. A. R. the rate will be only one fare or less for the return journey.

The Grand Stand events for Saturday, the opening day, will be the Horse Show in the afternoon with the splendid Vaudeville and Spectacular "Carnival of Venice" and fireworks at night.
