PREMIER TO PUT A STOP TO FOREIGN PLOTS

Fascist Chief Tells 100,000 in Rome this Must Cease—Leader to Revive Death Penalty.

ROME, Sept. 13.—The bomb flung at Premier Mussolini Saturday failed to reach its mark, but instead achieved the startlingly unexpected result of causing the relations of Fascist Italy and Republican France to be more tense than any day since the Black Shirts entered Rome in October 1922.

ATTEMPT TO SMUGGLE ALIENS INTO NOVA SCOTIA

HALIFAX, N. S., Sept. 13.—A party of 102 Italians from the island of Sicily rounded up during last night and early this morning by immigration authorities and officers of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police after they had landed yesterday afternoon from the Italian steamer Dori at Mill Cove on St. Margaret's Bay were brought to Halifax this morning by train and lodged in the immigration premises at Pier Two, there to remain under guard pending instructions from Ottawa.

BRITISH MARINES LANDED AT HANKOW

SHANGHAI, Sept. 13.—British marines were landed at Hankow on the Yangtze River today to protect British interests in consequence of the increasing anti-British manifestations resulting from the Cantonese occupation of the Hankow area.

King Predicts Liberal Victory

PEMBROKE, Ont., Sept. 13.—"It is becoming increasingly evident that tomorrow night we will witness a return to power of the Liberal party by a very large majority," said Mr. Mackenzie King here this afternoon.

Liberal Position Hopeless

The Liberals have only 199 candidates in the field—If sixty-five of those are defeated in Ontario—a low estimate—and twenty more are defeated in the Maritimes—another low estimate. That will be eighty-five Liberals defeated.

Well, then, if all the remaining Liberals were elected they would only number 114 members—Nine short of half the total membership of the House of Commons

And this is not taking into consideration the Liberal losses in Quebec, Manitoba, Alberta, Saskatchewan, or British Columbia

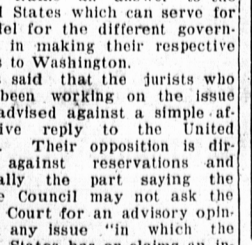
