

DROPPED DEAD AFTER ARREST ON THEFT CHARGE.
Reporter Alleged to Have Stolen \$3,860 Died at Police Headquarters.

MONTREAL, Jan. 23.—Charles E. Boivan, a reporter employed jointly by the Star and La Patrie, died suddenly at a police headquarters today just after he had been arrested on a charge of theft.

Deputy High Constable Lambert brought Boivan in on a charge of failing to account for \$3,860 which he was alleged to have collected as agent for the Saive Garde Insurance Company. Boivan was much worked up over his arrest and was in a state of collapse into unconsciousness and died before medical aid arrived.

For ten years Boivan was Quebec correspondent of La Patrie and came to Montreal a few months ago. Previously he was engaged in newspaper work at Fall River.

A POLITICAL TIE-UP.

LONDON, Jan. 24.—Today the membership of the House of Commons is a tie, the Conservatives and combined Liberal-Labor party, each having elected 218 representatives.

Never in the recollection of the oldest politicians have British parliaments been in such a perplexing position as they are today, and are likely to face when the next House of Commons is organized. So evenly divided will be the membership of the House and so close is the popular vote, that the elections may be considered a tie.

One hundred and sixty-seven seats remain to be filled, of which 102 are English.

In the last Parliament there were: Conservatives, 36; Liberals, 115; Nationalists, 16.

If the proportion of the voting constituencies neither Conservatives nor Liberals can muster a majority of more than a dozen, and the Nationalists, with 83, will be wholly masters of the situation.

It is now confidently expected that a dissolution and another general election will take place within six months, when the Conservatives will come into power, with a good working majority.

FURTHER NEWS OF DISASTER.

MONTREAL, Jan. 24.—The official list of the dead in the Woodrow wreck on the C.P.R. shows that thirty-one persons lost their lives and that the number may be increased by later reports. As the work of extracting the first-class car from the river is not yet completed, more bodies may be found in the submerged car. Most of the victims met death from drowning, nine dying from injuries received by the second-class car colliding with the bridge.

The report that the victims were injured by fire is denied.


