CHINA ALARMED AT AGGRESSION OF JAPANESE

Many Chinese Have a Distinct Idea That Japan is Their Country's Chief Menace—The Empress is Undoubtedly in Bad Health.

PEKIN, Nov. 6.—Japan to-day began entrusting the transportation of Japan-Pekin mails to the care of the Chinese post system which is an outcome of China's coercive action in refusing Japan the use of the Imperial Railways for her mail couriers. China's action was induced by Japan's postal aggression, her independent post office service in China having been troubled in two years and also to France's attempted re-establishment of couriers from Yunnan where the Indo-China post has been operated since 1901. It is as yet uncertain if France will withdraw her Indo-China post couriers which have been operating since a fortnight ago. The Chinese are sincerely alarmed at the undeviating aggressions of Japan and her allies and many Chinese are forming a distinct idea that Japan is China's prime menace. Seventy stations north of Kuan Cheng Tsu have been added to the Chinese telegraph system as a result of the

Russo-Chinese telegraph convention. Although the Dowager Empress was reported on Oct. 13 to be ill, the entire court returned from the summer palace to the forbidden city last night for the winter. Grand Councillors Yuan Shih Kai and Chang Chih Lun, are following the court. About 11,000 troops, recently brought from Paoting Fu, garrison the twelve miles intervening between the summer palace and Pekin. Considerable mystery surrounds the death three weeks ago of Princess Shun, the Empress's sister on account of the reserve maintained regarding women. As the Princess was a favorite of the ladies here many of the latter desired to console with the court but the officials were unable to enlighten the legations in regard to the passing away of the Princess. The suspension of the court's reception to foreigners for the past year and a half is evidence of the accuracy of the reports regarding the Dowager's ill-health.

AN UNCANNY MYSTERY FOUND IN GERMANY

How a Monk Lured Many Victims to an Awful death.

BERLIN, Nov. 6.—The "Petersburger Zeitung" relates a terrible story of crimes which have just been discovered at Werchoturi, in the government of Perm. For some years past a monk named Fedot has exercised powerful attraction over the inhabitants of the neighborhood, part cultury the women, on account of his eloquent sermons. Fedot was a member of a local monastery, but some three years ago one of his admirers, the widow of a rich merchant, had a hermitage built for him in the midst of the forest near the town, and to this secluded spot women of all ages went to hear the monk preach and to confess to him. Fedot was noted as an "original" in more than one way. A peculiar institution, to which he always attached considerable importance, was a bath-room belonging to the hermitage, to which he insisted that every woman who came to confess must first retire, in order that she might bathe, and appear before him "clean in body as well as in soul." Then before confessing she must lie down in a coffin so that she might become accustomed to the idea of death. Recently several young women of the district disappeared, but, despite the alarm caused, no one connected their disappearance with the happenings at Fedot's hermitage. A few days ago the wife of a young soldier, who had gone to see the monk, failed to return home, and growing suspicious the man proceeded to the hermitage, intending to force Fedot to disclose her whereabouts. Entering the hermitage he searched everywhere, but the monk was nowhere to be found, nor was there at first any sign of his wife. When he passed into the bathroom, however, he saw a coffin lying on the floor and lifting the lid was horror-stricken to find within it the dead body of his wife. He immediately informed the police, and they made a thorough search of the place. In a cellar beneath the hermitage they found a number of

other coffins lying side by side, and in each of them was a dead body of a woman. Every effort is being made to trace the missing monk, but up to the present nothing has been heard of him, nor can any motive be assigned for the ghastly crimes which have now been brought to light.

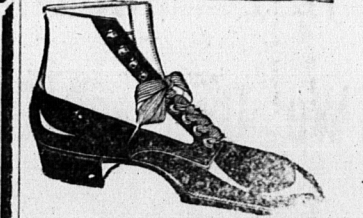
