Tonnage In Canadian Ports Decreased In '39 OTTAWA, June 3—(CP)—Heavy reduction in grain shipments due to unsettled world conditions before and after the outbreak of the war, has resulted in a 2,000,000-ton decrease in cargo handled by Canada's national harbours during 1939, according to the annual report of the National Harbours Board, tabled in the House of Commons today.

Beauharnois Bill Passes 3rd Reading On Division OTTAWA, June 3—(CP)—In the first recorded vote since the present session opened May 16, the House of Commons today passed some Conservative support to defeat by 110 to 32 an amendment that would have sent the Beauharnois bill back to committee.

Conservative leader Hanson said he could not support the amendment unless he knew what specific changes the C.C.F. sponsors of the motion expected to have made in committee. When the vote was taken, 15 of the Conservative members present voted with a solid C.C.F. and New Democracy group. Mrs. Doris Neilson (Unity-Nova Scotia) also voted with the minority. The remaining 11 Conservatives voted with the Government.

Transport Minister Howe, sponsor of the bill, said it was really a war measure since the additional power to be generated by Beauharnois was to be used for the production of electricity. The bill was given third reading and will not be discussed in the Senate. The House also made some progress with a Government measure to restore operations of the Farmers' Creditors Arrangement Act in Manitoba.

Mr. Goldwell said it should be clearly shown whether or not the Beauharnois Company was owned by Montreal Heat, Light and Power Company and the latter company was exporting power to the United States. The Beauharnois Company represented as capable of generating 500,000 horsepower with the present water flow and its commitment as far ahead as 1976 called for only 375,000 horsepower, Mr. Goldwell said.
