Commissioner Returns Home

QUEBEC, Que., Oct. 27—(By The Canadian Press)—Sir Alexander Gibb's report to the Dominion Government on Canadian Harbour administration and development may be expected in a month's time. Hon. Alfred Duranleau, Minister of Marine, stated today upon arrival from England on the Canadian Pacific liner Empress of Britain. He was accompanied by madame Duranleau. Asked to express an opinion on the political situation in Great Britain, the Minister was non-committal. "I would not care to express any view on a matter which pertains exclusively to other people. It is said, however, that the National Government will carry by a substantial majority," he stated. Hon. Mr. Duranleau while overseas visited as many European ports as possible to obtain a general idea of navigation facilities. "That alone was worth the trip and will be, I hope, of some use to me in the administration of the 141 seaports in Canada," he said.

Proper Selection Of Ewe-Lambs Is Important

(Experimental Farms Note) One of the principal ways of improving the farmer's flock is through the selection of ewe-lambs in the fall when they are well developed. For a good selection, the two main factors to consider are conformation and development, and wool.

1.—Conformation and development. Each breeder knows by experience that his ewes are not all equally well formed and developed and that their offspring are not all of the same value.

Therefore, before choosing the ewe-lambs which are to be used for the improvement of the flock, the breeder should first find out not only which qualities are to be introduced, but also the defects to be eliminated. It will then be easier to make a selection. When choosing the ewe-lambs, one must always pay particular attention to the bony frame which should be good and firm. The back and rump must be straight and strong; the legs short, straight, solid and apart; the body long and deep in order to provide plenty of space for the development of the foetus. The ribs should also be long and well sprung and the chest ample and deep, indicating a good constitution.

2.—Wool. The wool is also an important feature as besides protecting the sheep, it yields an appreciable income. When selecting, it will therefore be necessary to consider both the quantity and quality of the wool. It should be dense, soft, elastic and lustrous, without neglecting also the fineness and length. Especially, avoid keeping in the flock ewes with bellies not well covered with wool, for that fault will be still more noticeable in the progeny.

In 1921 the Experimental Station of Ste. de la Postiere received a flock of sheep of very poor quality as to conformation and development as well as quality of wool. The average weight was 98 pounds for ewes and 73 pounds for ewe-lambs. After 7 years of selection and good care through proper feeding and also the use of good rams, the average weight for ewes is 170 pounds, and for ewe-lambs 98.4 pounds.
