Increasing Costs Of Inquests Aired

DALHOUSIE, N. B., Jan. 18.—(OP)—Increasing cost of inquests in Restigouche County were discussed today at the county council's meeting. Dr. J. A. Roy, Councillor from Campbellton, expressed opinion that more than half of the inquests held in the county were unnecessary. An inquest held in this county into the death of a man injured in Quebec province was mentioned by another councillor. The council decided to advise coroners they must file a declaration of costs that an inquest is necessary, as provided by the coroners' act, and must discontinue a practice of calling the clerk of the peace for inquests.

THE LATE ANDREW MORRISSEY

There passed away at the Charlottetown Hospital, January 6, 1939, Mr. Andrew Morrissey, Vernon, a gentleman widely known and highly esteemed throughout the district.

The late Mr. Morrissey was born at Earncliffe, December 1876. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Walter Morrissey of that place.

The deceased was a resident of the United States for many years. He later moved to the Island where he purchased one of the most up to date farms in Mt. Herbert. He resided here until last June when owing to ill health he was forced to dispose of his property. He then acquired a smaller property at Vernon Bridge where he opened a store.

The deceased was of a very quiet disposition and was never known to say anything which might in any way harm a person's reputation. He was sober, honest and industrious and ready at all times to lend a helping hand to those in need irrespective of class or creed.

During his illness in the Charlottetown Hospital he was frequently visited by His Excellency the Bishop, and other clergy.

He received the last rites of the Holy Catholic Church from Rev. Bernard Gillis. He had the consolation of having his family at his bedside during his illness and death.

The remains were taken to his late home Vernon, and viewed by a concourse of people who were often benefited by his wise counsel.

The funeral was held Monday morning, January 9. The High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the pastor Monstinger Maurice McDonald, who also conducted services at the grave.

Besides his heart-broken widow formerly Martha Acorn of Millview, he leaves to mourn one daughter (Helen) Mrs. Power, Boston, Mass., one son Walter, Hartford, Conn., two sisters, (Emma) Mrs. Dowland, Providence, R. I., (Florence) Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary, Boston, Mass., one brother Wendelin, East Royalty, P. E. I. One daughter, Reta predeceased him some years ago. The pall bearers were: Messrs. James Morrissey, William Acorn, Joseph Power, Anthony Beagan, Joseph Acorn, William Coezy.

May his soul rest in peace.
