A VERY interesting meeting of the Teachers' Primary Union was held in Kindergarten Hall on Saturday afternoon at 4 o'clock. The President Miss Watham, opened the meeting with devotional exercises, after which Mrs. Albert Morrison taught in a very engaging manner the Sunday School lesson to a class of little children. The great interest shown by the little hearers proved the success of the method employed by the instructress. After the lesson followed a discussion as to the best mode of conducting a primary classroom. Several new members were enrolled. The Union forms a very efficient aid to any one who may take advantage of it.

ON Arbor day in the city schools the pupils of Queen Squares school were unable to plant trees because there was no room to plant. In Toronto apparently the same difficulty was experienced. An exchange says: At the Normal school there is no room to plant any more trees so the scholars will be unable to celebrate Arbor Day after the wonted fashion. However, they will celebrate in an altogether new method. Nine plots in the ground have been prepared, one for each grade in the school. The boys will have their plots on their own side of the school and the girls will have plots on their side. Flower seeds will be placed in the ground, which will be tended to by the children, under the supervision of the teachers and the science-master, Mr. J. H. Putman. The pupils will watch the germination of the seeds and the growth of the plants and will thus be given a series of valuable object lessons.

THE gym astic exhibition given in Y. M. C. A. Saturday afternoon gives a very good idea of the physical work, done by that institution. Any one who notices closely the exercises given cannot but be impressed with the number of muscles brought into play. In the drills and marching, light quick movements strengthen the muscles, and vital organs. The apparatus work is heavier and more vigorous, and is very beneficial. Exercise should be taken by all who desire to have good health, and systematic work taken under the direction of a competent instructor is certainly to be desired. Great improvement is seen in the class for school boys. The wonderful agility, and endurance shown speaks well for the exercises given. Growing boys should have plenty of exercise and the Y. M. C. A's throughout the country are doing a great work in this department. Exhibitions such as have been given during the past week showed what is possible in the way of physical development in a short time.
