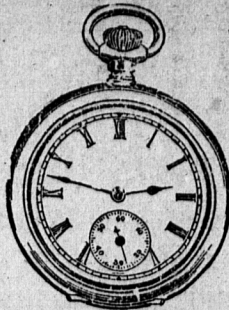

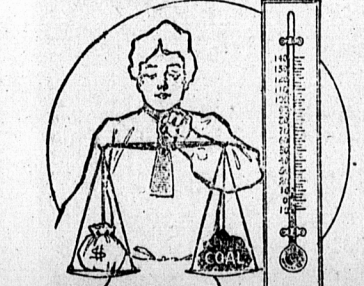

CONCERNING CHINESE IN NEW YORK CITY
Of every 750 persons in New York

city one is a Chinese. The Chinese students' club has seventy-five members. There are Chinese members of the national guard and Chinese boy scouts. In the tong war of January last between the Four Brothers and the On Leongs' fifty men were killed or wounded. Most Chinese in America are males; but there are in New York fifty-six pure Chinese families with about one hundred and fifty full-blooded children. Those who are old enough attend the public schools. There are not more than one hundred Chinese women and girls of marriageable age in New York, but many Chinese have married white women. There is a Chinese public chamber at sixteen Mott street, representing the merchants and trade guilds. It sometimes sits as a board of arbitration. Suits between Chinese seldom get into court. The Imperial Chinese board of education in Peking has established in New York a Chinese school. Most of its fifty pupils attend the public schools also, and three learn
