The Cheese Board held its regular meetings in the office of J. D. Jenkins, city, during the summer months and had a fairly successful year. The quantity of cheese offered was not as large as usual, but the prices paid were the highest in the history of the board as will be seen by the comparative statement below.

The first meeting was held on June 28th and the officers were elected on that date. President, George Brown, New Glasgow. Vice-Pres.: J. F. Profit, Kensington; Secty-Treas and Salesman; Robert Jenkins, Mount Albion; Official Weighers, R. H. Jenkins, city and Alexander McDonald, Glenfinnan.

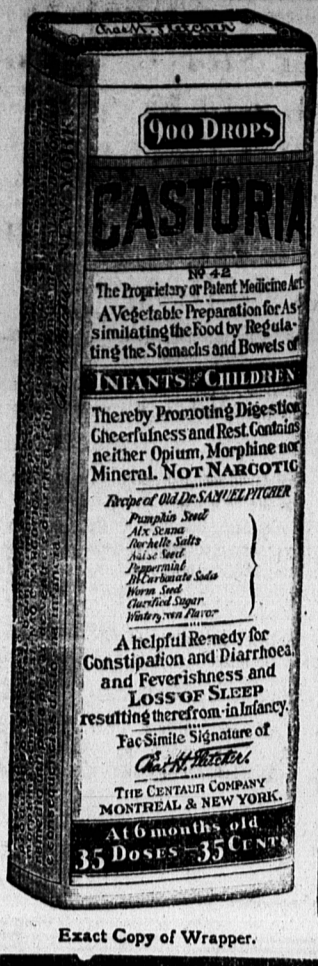
