# RACE WAR IN AMERICAN TOWN

Whites And Colored People Fight Viciously And Troops Have to Be Called Out--Several Negroes Killed--Quarrel Between Drivers on Road was Beginning

WABALAK, Miss., Dec. 30. Conductor Robert Harrison, of the Mobile & Ohio Railroad, was ambushed and seriously wounded by a negro. He died yesterday. The origin of the racial troubles here was caused primarily by the meeting in a narrow roadway of wagons driven by a white and a negro respectively. The negro abused the white man, who reported the occurrence to the white villagers at Wabalak. Whites immediately armed themselves, and in a fight with the negroes of the community a number of white men were killed, including one of the most prominent of the villagers. The number of negroes killed in the riots has not been ascertained, but it is believed to have been reported in many parts of the settlement since the trouble started.

**TROOPS CALLED OUT.**  
 Meridian, Miss., Dec. 29.—The two companies of state militia sent to Wabalak returned to Meridian yesterday, their presence there being apparently unnecessary. After their arrival at Wabalak no disturbance occurred, although it is believed that three negroes, including George Simpson, one of the principals in the disturbance aboard the Mobile & Ohio train last Sunday, had been lynched here before the arrival of the troops. The citizens of Wabalak, while not admitting the fact that the men were captured by a posse, were "lost in the swamp" while on their way to town.

Two sons of Simpson were shot to death yesterday afternoon. As nearly as can be ascertained at this time the casualties result from the trouble are as follows:  
 An unknown negro shot by Conductor Cooper on the Mobile & Ohio train.  
 Constable O'Brien, killed by George Simpson when an attempt to arrest was made.  
 George Simpson, lynched.  
 Tom Simpson, son of George Simpson, shot to death by white men near Wabalak.  
 Jim Simpson, shot to death.  
 Two unknown negroes lynched.  
 Conductor Cooper, seriously injured by being cut and stabbed several times by George Simpson, not fatal.  
 Leland Sparkman soldier, fleshwound in left knee, accidental discharge of his own pistol.

Officers of the militia companies state that on their arrival at Wabalak no county officials were on hand to which they could report, and that during their stay there none of the county officials appeared among the troops. Colonel McCants, who was in charge of the troops stated to the citizens that while the soldiers were always ready to reply to a call for assistance, a real need should be apparent before they were called on. He forbade armed bodies of men riding through the country, and would permit no act which indicated violence.

The soldiers state they found armed parties in charge when they reached the scene.

**THE LATE NEIL GORDON.**

 Their passed away, after a short illness, on Friday Nov. 21, at his residence, Strathadam, Miramichi, N. B., Neil Gordon in the 87th year of his age.

The deceased was survived by one son and five daughters, who have the sympathy of the community in the loss of a loving father.

Mr. Gordon married Miss Barbara Johnstone, daughter of the late Thomas Johnstone of Bonaventure, Miramichi, she died on May 27, 1906.

The deceased was a son of the late Robert Gordon of Cascumpe, P. E. I. and was born in 1820 and came to the Miramichi in 1850 and engaged in farming and lumbering. He was a man of decided christian principles, and was a member of St. James' Presbyterian Church, Newcastle.

His cheerful manner and kindly ways won for him many friends and his name will not soon be forgotten in the community where for over a half century he was a prominent man.

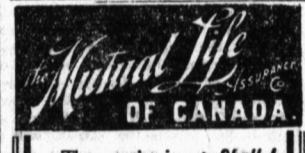
