ELECTRICAL INSPECTORS' DUTIES.

We quoted yesterday the law which empowers the City Council to appoint an inspector of electrical appliances. The same statute gives the Council power to define the duties of any and all officials and employees of the city. It is obvious that when an electrical inspector, or city electrician is appointed that a competent electrician should be selected for the position and that his duties should be fully defined. Generally his duties would be to obey the instructions given him from time to time by the Mayor and Council, but he would have specific duties by the virtue of his position and these ought to be formally set forth by the Council.

He would have the control and direction of the fire alarm service and of any other electric wires or plant owned by the city, and be expected to keep the same in good working order at all times; and also to have the care and maintenance of all wiring in city property and all apparatus or fixtures connected therewith. It would be his duty to inspect the condition, insulation, attachments, construction and arrangement of all electric wires and posts, erected upon the streets, and of all wires designed to carry electric light or power current to and within all buildings throughout the city and to report all violations of law or civic ordinances relating to the same. Also to cause the Electric Company having the contract for street lighting to keep the street lamps clean and in good order for use and to see that they are kept lighted as their contract provides and the public convenience requires, and to see that all other conditions of the lighting contract are complied with.

Such are some of the obvious duties which would devolve upon a city electrician. He would also be expected to take a general oversight of all electric wires connected with any building with a view to the public safety, and to inspect and pass upon all new wiring and installations of electric service with a view to ensuring public safety, and especially the greater security from fires which are often caused by defective insulation. Without going further in this recital we think it will be apparent not only that a city electrician is necessary but that his duties are of very great importance to the public security and general welfare. There is reason to believe that there is much defective wiring in the city, that some serious fires

and one or more deaths have been caused, and a number of serious shocks received which a proper inspection by a competent electrician might have prevented. Thus the security for both life and property are involved in this matter. An inspector is needed and the best available man ought to be promptly engaged, his duties defined and a sufficient salary provided to remunerate him for his services.

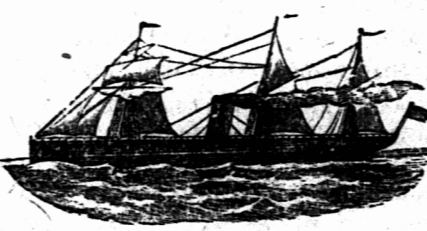
