THERE is scarcity already of some sorts of Canadian wood, and greater scarcity is predicted by Ottawa newspapers, which say that several of the drives have been stuck in the rivers. Pulp, too, is going to be scarce. Wages are higher and lumber prices, they say, must advance. We have seen a circular from the E. B. Eddy Company, whose consumption of wood for paper and pulp, etc., is very large. This circular says that lumber for the sides and backs of washboards is absolutely unobtainable hereabouts at any price, so the company have had to withdraw prices, and may have to temporarily stop the manufacture of washboards.

### THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

Reply to James Carruthers.

SIR—In a late issue of the Pioneer Mr. James Carruthers has a somewhat bitter letter against the Grand Division for passing a resolution deploring the non-enforcement of the C. T. A. particularly throughout Prince County. The resolution said nothing about the Prosecutor and was intended to arouse public attention to the disgraceful state of affairs now existing. It is true some members accused the Prosecutor of making no move when information is given him. One member whose reliability all accepted, stated that some three weeks before that date he had the proof of information being mailed Mr. C. and up to that time we reply being received nor anything being done. So the matter of veracity in that case remains between Mr. Carruthers and that Brother. But as to his statements that he has always promptly attended to every information, it is untrue and Mr. C. knows it. The writer has personal knowledge of information being given by a reliable man and he did not proceed.

The difficulty is not so much that he does not proceed when a case is made out for him, but that he is absolutely useless in the conducting of a case. For the recent cases at Kensington particulars were put in his hands, a brief in short, and he made no use of it whatever but allowed witnesses off by asking one or two simple childish questions—and so easily did the cases fall that the accused gave the witnesses a goose supper that evening over it and Mr. C's continuance in office.

Mr. C. finds himself out of harmony with his former friends of the Grand Division because they have been dissatisfied with him as a prosecutor and instead of resigning at once he dropped his principles on the license question and dropped his connection with the Order. But he stays by the salary. Mr. C. not only tries his own defence but the Premier's also. His purpose in so doing is too transparent. He evidently thinks he can have party feeling as a protection by so doing. Well, if Mr. Farquharson is to be judged as a temperance man by the man he has as prosecutor in East Prince his boasted reputation will suffer badly. Resign Mr. C. at once; you are a stumbling block in the way.
