No doubt by the time that navigation is clear the light little Island will greatly require the contents of these cars. In the mean time the prosperous Island farmers are capable of providing the necessities of life."

A WRITER to the Sydney Record speaking of the clan Macdonald says: "In the diocese of Antigonish alone there are at least 10 Macdonalds, including the vicar-general and several D. D.'s.
