the newly created Grain Growers Party. Added to the Liberal tirades of calumny was their insistent demand for free trade in natural and some other products, AS ADOPTED IN THEIR OTTAWA PLATFORM, and this was further accentuated in the Cerear Grain Growers policy.

But with the approach of an election the time for action on the part of the Government forces arrived, and like the illustration of the great British Lion, lying idly sure for a season not noticing the pin pricks of the tormenting boys but, when aroused, with a swish of his tail sending the whole phalanx into kingdom come, so the Meighen Government opening up their campaign with the floodgates of truth and fact have sent the calculators chasing into every corner for refuge and cover. Scandal after scandal was exploded and falsehood crammed down the throats of the originators. To those who were so prolific in making charges of corruption the war was carried right to their own doors until they commenced to squeal for mercy, and as in the case of Lemieux dodging away from the Royal Commission appointed to investigate his charges, and the Cerear Grain Growers seeking for injunction to escape enquiry into their own acts, the whole combination were in busy quest for places of hiding, and their tongues of slander as against the Government were made more busy in finding excuses to get out of their own difficulties.

And when they got out amongst the people they found their free trade dogmas even more unpopular than their slanders, and from place to place they the "Weary wandering Willie" King and the Grain Growers advocate Cerear are trying to allay the aroused indignation of the people, against this policy, by repudiating it as an actual policy in some places, and in others by the assurances that they won't kill the trade of Canada all at once, but only inch by inch the death not to be consummated for at least five years. These manoeuvres of King and Cerear probably more than anything else may be taken to indicate the way the wind is blowing and in what direction the peoples' minds are swinging. If they did not in their wanderings make the discovery that Protection was the popular theme they would never thus leave their policy for which they clamoured so vigorously only a short year ago, as an abandoned and rejected foundling upon the roadside. If free trade, or tariff revision downward, and free eggs and pork were the things the people wanted, they would still be preaching their last year theories, but their eyes have been opened as they see their old time support, and the quiet honest Liberalism of the country joining in the support of the National Liberal and Conservative party.
