### Remainder of Friday's Evidence At Supreme Court

The following is the remainder of the evidence given Friday at the Supreme Court in connection with the manslaughter case.

At the afternoon session the first witness called was Officer Wm. McInnis (sworn) I live in Charlottetown, I am a police officer. I was on duty July 18th last at 3.30 a. m. of 18th received a telephone message from Alton Burke, Southport, I told Officer Trainor the message. We both started for Marine Wharf and got a motor boat and went right over I saw nobody when we landed. Shortly after saw a man coming down. I was just coming day break. I saw Dennis Peters. He was in shirt sleeves, bare head. His clothing were dry. I asked him how he came to put the car over the wharf. He said it was not him. It was McCoubrey who was driving. I asked him if anybody was in the car. He said "No." I asked him who was with him, he remembered Roberts. I asked him where he was. He said up in the village, I didn't seem to get satisfactory answers from him. He was half drunk then. I said to Trainor "I had better go up to Burke's to find from the other fellow if anybody was in the car." We went to Burke's. Trainor, Peters and myself. We found McCoubrey at Burke's in the kitchen. We met Mr. McDonald and Mr. Burke in the kitchen. I asked McCoubrey if anybody went over the wharf in the car. He said two, Roberts and Youland and he went over himself. I asked him if he was sure. He said he was positive. Peters was there then, Peters remarked that Roberts wasn't in the car. Then he said after "well he might have been." McCoubrey was in a half crying condition. His clothes were wet. He looked to me like a fellow who was drinking. He said he wished he had stayed with the fellows who were in the car. Peters said before we left the wharf that he pulled a man from the water who was drowning. I asked him who he was. He said he didn't know. From Burke I went to my brother's—Ernest McInnis to wake him up. I got him to give us a hand. By that time several had gathered. We went to Geo. McDonald's. Peters was with us. We got block and tackle with us. McDonald's tackle. Came to conclusion no use in trying. I said I would notify the government diver at Railway wharf. Peters was on wharf when we were trying to hoist car. He was worrying about his car. McCoubrey told me he could not swim a stroke. Went to Police Station and rang up Ivan Reddin. I was trying to get a diver notified. James Roberts he lived on Richmond St., at Royal Hotel. I didn't go back to Southport, I was at Royal Hotel in the morning. The prisoners seemed to be a lot better. I noticed the car track on wharf at Southport on the plank and track of both tires where it went over. The head of wharf he piled very close together. Piles were very smooth. The sides of wharf are level. A stringer runs along both sides. There was no railing. Steps come up on east side about 50 or 60 feet from head on the plank part. On the wharf I picked up a sweater on west corner of wharf. I asked Peters if it was his, he said yes. I noticed a white collar up on clay work on west side of car track. Down on plank I noticed a wet spot on wharf about 4 or 5 feet from west side of wharf. The wet space was probably 3 feet long, 2 feet wide. (Cross examined by Mr. Bentley) Trainor was in the station when call came. Got to Southport about quarter of ten to four. It was blowing a breeze, and sure. There was quite a roll on the sea.
