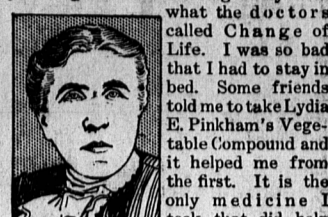

Villet, Fred Clark, Warren Newsome and others spoke at some length on the subject and pointed out the objections to the present system of weighing and delivering cattle in Charlottetown. Messrs Angus McDonald, W. B. Trowsdale, S. Cameron, Fred Clark and H. Beebe, were then appointed a committee and the following resolution drafted and signed by all present:—We the undersigned farmers of Tryon, Crapaud, Westmoreland, Hampton, Victoria and other sections do hereby agree to sell this season beef cattle, subject to the following terms and conditions—viz.—1.—The purchaser must take delivery of said cattle at Victoria F.O.B.—11.—The cattle must be weighed at Victoria and accepted at full weight.

JUL.—All cattle offered for shipment must be fasted for at least twelve hours before weighing. A copy of the above resolution was placed in the hands of the committeeman for signatures, and after a vote of thanks to the chairman to which he made a suitable reply, the meeting was closed.—Patriot please copy.
