(Canadian Press) TORONTO, Sept. 13.—With sales on the mining section of the Toronto Stock Exchange today passing the 700,000 mark for the first time this week, prices moved irregularly, high- or a market devoid of any special feature. The index for 20 golds stood at 105.11, compared with 104.61 yesterday with a fall for 20 miscellaneous mines advanced from 91.31 yesterday to 92.46.

The senior golds finished somewhat soft. Wright Hargreaves and Lake Shore held steady but Teck Hughes and the 2 at 3.98 and Hollinger had a 20-point setback to 13.55. Advances, however, were scored by Little Long Lac and Pioneer.

The base metal list was soft. Lead metals dropped back 1 to 35, Fall-bridge lost 5 at 4.25 and Sudbury Baska had a seven-point loss at 1.58. Noranda gained fractionally.

(Canadian Press) WINNIPEG, Sept. 13.—Late session continuation of export sales of Canadian wheat aggregating 1,000,000 bushels gave prices a pre-closing flip on the Winnipeg Grain Ex- change today. Values closed 1/2 to 3/4 cent higher after earlier unsteadiness.

Both October and December futures closed at 90 1/2 cents; the May option at 93 1/2; bid trade was generally quiet until the late flurry, with a sharp decline in the price of grain in a narrow price range. Liberal selling prevailed throughout the session.

Astronomy Is Fascinating Study

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, Sept. 13.—"Astronomy is a fascinating," Dr. Anne J. Cannon, for 50 years a star-gazer, said today between sessions of the American Astronomical Society's convention.

"My interest has never weakened. I've had others much younger than I complain their interest has waned. But for me there is still the same thrill. Perhaps it is because there is always something new to find," the scientist, who at 70 years of age is the most famous woman astronomer in the world, remarked.

Dr. Cannon shared with the late Madame Curie of France and others the honor of receiving the Ellen Richards' prize for outstanding work in research by women.

"I was the last recipient of the prize," she said. "It was founded to encourage women to study science. But because it was for women no longer needed encouragement. I have continued it, however, for women in astronomy. It is called after me now and goes to women astronomers."

Sixty Million Gallons Apple Cider Produced U. S. Annually

60,000,000 gallons of apple cider are produced in the United States annually which require approximately 16,000,000 bushels of apples. The easterners would seem to be the hardest apple cider drinkers for 13 per cent of the apple crop in that part of the United States goes into cider while only 4 per cent of the western crop is used. Of the total annual production of apples in the United States, estimated at 155,000,000 bushels, 60 per cent goes into commercial, fresh apple consumption. Europe is the big export market for fresh apples, taking 95 per cent of the total exports, which account for about 17 per cent of the total exports, which account for about 17 per cent of the total commercial production, according to the Agricultural Department of the Canadian National Railways. Britain takes the greatest percentage, 45, the remainder goes to Germany, Holland, France, Belgium and Scandinavian countries. As in the case of fresh fruit, Britain is the big market for United States canned apples, taking approximately 89 per cent of the total exports, with the Irish Free State, Dutch West Indies, Panama, the Philippines, Germany and Belgium taking the balance.

TRY A HUCKLEBERRY GRIN OR HARLESQUE

ATLANTIC CITY, Sept. 13.—Instead of a Bronx cocktail, a Tom Collins or an old-fashioned, the U.S. National Women's Christian Temperance Union recommends a November 21st, a huckleberry grin or a Harlesque for those home social gatherings.

And for the athletically minded it has a special temperance drink "with intriguing touches," named the "barley water."

These are among some of the special beverages worked out by the W.C.T.U. department of non-alcoholic fruit products during the past year. They were reported at the sixty-first annual convention here yesterday by Mrs. Blanche Pennington of Elizabeth, national director of that division.

A booklet of recipes, designed to compete with the recent flood of mixed recipe handouts, is being prepared. Beside the temperance drinks already named it includes the rhubarb punch and the New England blackberry cup.

November chill is described as a "cranberry beverage, especially appropriate in stem glasses for the happy holiday dinner or with ice cream in frappe glasses for lighter occasions." Huckleberry grin is a rich acidless fruit juice with ice cream soda. Harlesque is watermelon crushed to a liquid.

Late Buying Halts Market Down Trend

(C.P. by Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, Sept. 13.—(C.P.)—Buying set in late in the day on the Montreal Stock Exchange today and a minor rally served to wipe out losses in different sections of the list. The rally failed to extend throughout the market, however, and scattered losses offset gains.

The effect of the report of increased earnings for the last year by E.C. Power spread to the B issues, which surged up 7-8 of a point at 3-7-8. The A shares, which were quick to react to the announcement by a broad advance yesterday, continued to move higher, registering a gain of 3-8 at 24-3-4.

Alcohols were unaffected by the announcement that Canadian Industrial Alcohol had purchased a large block of shares of Old-Tyme Distilleries, Inc., New York, in order to provide a new outlet for their stock in the United States and had taken an option on another large block. Both Canadian Industrial Alcohol A and B were unchanged at the close after narrow fluctuations.
