AMONG the first contingent of English children to arrive in Canada as war guests was a group of 25 brought to a place of safety by Mr. Wallace R. Campbell, president of the Canadian Ford organization. The children were welcomed to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Campbell in Windsor, Ontario, where they were cared for until placed in their new homes. Some of the children posed for a "family group" with their host and hostess, left to right, Tony Hampson and Peter Daniels, in back row; Mrs. Campbell, Lorna Thacker, Doreen Fowler, Peter Brister, Mr. Campbell and four-year old Peter Fowler seated on a toy fire truck. Another 100 children will reach the Campbell's home later on under an arrangement made between Mr. Campbell and Lord Perry, head of the Ford company in England. Many of these will be war guests of families in the Ford organization in Windsor. These children are not a part of the movement of children under the Government plan.

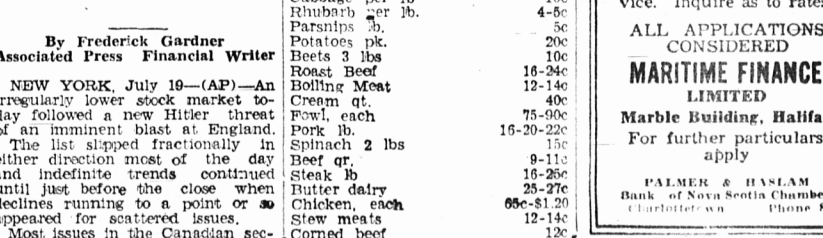
