—FALSEHOOD IS HELD WORSE THAN MURDER.

—CALGARY.—Evidence in the trial of the two Eskimos, accused of the murder of two priests in the Arctic region, was slow in coming out today, due to the complications of interpreting from Eskimo to the English tongue.

Uluksu, one of the accused, was on the stand. He told of the killing of the priests and of the eating of the liver of the dead. This, he said, is a custom of the Eskimo tribe to which he belongs.

Ivaneek, another Eskimo, who was a guide with the Stefansson expedition, was on the stand a greater part of the afternoon. He described the customs of the tribes of the far north. The law of the tribes, he said, encouraged the killing of certain persons, among these being the insane and incurable. He said that lying and stealing were far more serious offences than the taking of human life.



HARD COAL PRICE FIXED

WASHINGTON.—President Wilson yesterday took a firm stand in a fight to obtain cheaper anthracite coal for the consuming public.

By an executive order, the conditions of which affects every individual in the United States, he named Dr. Harry A. Garfield, president of Williams College, Coal Administrator, and fixed the price of anthracite coal at the mouth of the mines, and the conditions under which jobbers will be permitted to operate.

The regulation of the retailer was left in the hands of Dr. Garfield with authority to use drastic power, and with full instructions to exert every effort to bring relief throughout the country. It was generally conceded here that the President's action would mean a decided drop in anthracite coal prices to householders and other consumers within a very short time.

The price fixed by the President for coal at the mine are approximately those which the operators agreed upon voluntarily in conference with the Federal Trade Commission some months ago, and it is believed, therefore, that the new Coal Administrator will find little trouble in that direction.

WENT OVER THE FALLS.

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont.—Mrs. John C. Callahan, Buffalo, came here and identified a hat belonging to her husband, who committed suicide by going over the falls yesterday afternoon. The man, who was about 45, jumped into the river on the American side a short distance above the falls and people standing at Prospect Point saw him carried over the brink. Just as he was going over the falls he turned his head to the people on the shore, showing his face, which was bloody, as he had struck a rock. His hat blew off just as he jumped into the water. Mrs. Callahan said she could give no reason for the rash act.

BLAZING STEAMER MAKING FOR PORT

HALIFAX.—With a bad fire in her holds, a big British tramp steamer was expected to make port early this afternoon. The steamer which was bound from an Atlantic port to England yesterday, sent a wireless to Halifax that there was a blaze in a portion of the cargo and that she was making for this port at all possible speed.

The steamer is laden with flour and oil. The fire is raging in the flour-filled holds, and, as far as can be learned, is under control. There is oil in tanks underneath the holds, however, and should the fire reach this there would be an explosion. Arrangements have been made to anchor the steamer in quarantine comparatively remote from all other shipping and devise the best possible means of pumping out the oil, with the utmost despatch. It is possible that the steamer will be detained here for some time. She is well known at Halifax, having undergone extensive repairs at this port following a stranding on the Nova Scotia coast.

DYNAMITE STOLEN PEOPLE ALARMED

ST. PETERS.—A rather strange occurrence has taken place in this town, which causes much speculation and in some quarters alarm.

Rev. Father McDonald, parish priest here, has in operation, a limestone quarry at Salmon river. Together with some machinery and other supplies for the quarry, he had in his storehouse in St. Peter's a quantity of dynamite. During his absence from town the warehouse was broken into and the dynamite taken. At the same time a warehouse belonging to Mr. Wheeler, of the St. Peter's canal works was also broken into and a lesser quantity taken.

The occurrence at this critical period has given rise to suspicious motives and all the industries and public places have accordingly been warned. Extra night watchmen have been placed at the bridge over St. Peter's canal, also on C. G. R. bridge at Grand Narrows, and at various mines in Cape Breton precautions are being taken.

Detectives from Sydney have been on the scene, but up to the present no clue has been found, nor can the citizens recall the presence of any strangers who would arouse suspicions.
