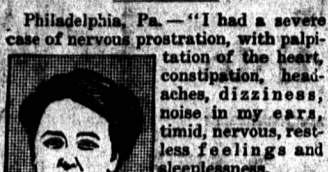

PASSED TO HIS REWARD

The community of Norway, Lot 1, lost its oldest and one of its most respected members on the morning of March 15th, when Mr. Peter Doyle passed away in his 89th year. Though in excellent health up till ten days before his death he fell an easy victim to the dread disease of grippe.

When he realized that death was approaching he prepared to meet it with calm Christian fortitude, and with a courage and strengthened in his last moments by the rites of the Catholic Church. Sixty grandchildren and five great grandchildren are left to mourn besides one brother, Lawrence Doyle and a sister Mrs. M. Brennan of Tignish. The funeral took place at Tignish church on Sunday evening of March 15th, ninety sleighs following the remains to the church where the funeral service was sung by Rev. Father McDougall, after which the remains of the grand old man were laid to rest in the family plot. May he rest in peace.
