SALADS

**Spinach Salad:** Boil spinach until tender, drain, and chop fine or rub through a sieve. Add a little chopped onion, and mix well with French dressing, chill and serve on lettuce leaves with mayonnaise dressing, and garnish with hard-boiled eggs cut in thin slices, or with slices of lemon. Lettuce may be boiled and served in the same way. This is an economical method of using the large outside leaves from a head of lettuce, which are too often thrown away.

**Lettuce and Bacon Salad:** Fry strips of bacon until crisp; drain on paper, and allow to cool. Break or cut the bacon into small pieces and mix it with shredded lettuce. Serve on lettuce leaves with French dressing. Garnish with radishes or olives.

**Macaroni Salad:** Boil large macaroni until tender, drain, and allow to cool. With a pair of scissors, cut the pieces of macaroni into small pieces, forming little rings. Marinade well with French dressing, to which chopped onion has been added, and serve on lettuce leaves.

**Drain pineapple well, add sugar, cherries and marshmallows. Soften the cream cheese and gradually work in the mayonnaise to make a smooth mixture, then fold in the whipped cream and combine with the fruit. Pour into refrigerator tray. Place cherries on top so that when cut into servings one will be in the centre of each portion. Serve on lettuce. If desired may be served with mayonnaise, thinned with whipped cream, reserving cherries for garnish.**
