MONTREAL, Dec. 20.—Montreal and Ottawa waged another of their epic overtime matches in the National Hockey League here Saturday night, but in the eighty minutes of play neither was able to score.

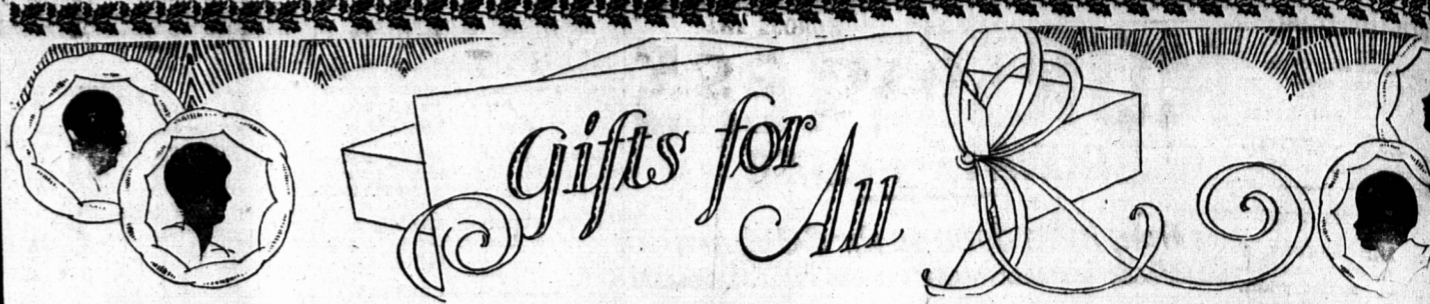
Maroons were back to their championship from the Ottawa showed their defeat by Detroit was just a bad game out of their system and not the start of a slump. Probably the result was indicative of the play, although Montreal put over a terrific offensive in the second period which their supporters thought gave them a margin. 
