BRITAIN AND U.S. QUADRUPLE THEIR STRENGTH

IN ORDER TO ENSURE THE PEACE OF THE WORLD IN COMING YEARS

(Special to the Guardian.) WASHINGTON, June 17.—As security against the renaissance of German military powers it was disclosed before the Senate military affairs committee today by General March, Chief of Staff, that the United States and Great Britain had reached a virtual agreement to maintain their military strength for an indefinite period at four times that which either had before the great war. General March indicated the belief of the Allied Governments that this great augmentation of military power on their part would be essential as a guarantee of the peace of the world.
