Go to Church Every Sunday Says Judge

NEW YORK, Feb. 16.—Judge Gibbs, in the Bronx County Court, sentenced a prisoner to go to church every Sunday for the next three years. The prisoner, Louis Ehrhardt, was sentenced to go to church every Sunday for the next three years for a charge of grand larceny in the second degree. He postponed sentence until the 14th.

Ehrhardt was convicted by a jury ten minutes last week on a charge of stealing an overcoat and quantity of jewelry from Mrs. Missine, 35 740 Trinity Ave., Dec. 4th, while her apartment was in charge of Charlotte Valind, 77 744 Trinity Ave. He was arrested on Dec. 10th.

When the prisoner was asked if he had anything to say before sentence was pronounced he requested to be given another chance assuring the Court he would make good. Judge Gibbs, in looking over the prisoner's record found that he had served in the N. Y. City Reformatory and the Bronx County Jail.

Asked by the Court if he realized he was facing a severe term, the prisoner replied, "I'll make good if you give me another chance. I will do everything in my power to make restitution. I'll get a job and work my fingers to the bone. I'll make good. Your Honor, only give me

another chance."
"I am going to postpone sentence began the Judge, "for four or five months. I am going to give you a chance—your last chance. I seldom give a man more than one chance. You are afflicted with some strange disease. You have been a victim of circumstances and were too weak to help yourself. If you don't make good, I will be disappointed; if you do, I will be satisfied that I did the right thing."

"I want you to get a job and to work steady. You will pay Mrs. Milstone \$10 a month until you have paid her \$50, the amount of her loss. You will go to church every Sunday and report to the priest."

"In a short time I will ask that priest to write the Court a letter as to your conduct. The Court cannot do as much as the Church for you. You must appeal to God to help you. You are not strong enough to get along without God's help."

"Go to church every Sunday at least. Two or three times a week would do you no harm. The court will do its part and it wants you to do yours."

"I want you to know that your tears of last week, when you cried at the thought of the disgrace you had brought upon your mother and father, played a big part in your receiving another chance. I am firmly convinced that they were shed with the utmost sincerity."
