Sask. Farm Loan Act Declared Ultra Vires

OTTAWA, May 13 (CP)—The Supreme Court of Canada in a 5 to 1 judgment today ruled that the Saskatchewan Government has not the power to use the rate of interest as a yardstick by which the principal of farmers' debts or housing loans might be reduced in poor crop years.

The court, with Mr. Justice Robert Taschereau dissenting, declared ultra vires section six of the Saskatchewan Farm Security Act. The section provided that in any year in which a farmer's crop yield was less than \$6 an acre, the principal owing on all mortgages or bills of sale would be reduced by the amount of interest due. At the same time the date for the final payment of principal would be postponed a year.

A related reference, making similar provision in regard to debts in connection with housing enterprises, was automatically declared ultra vires by the same decision.

Premier Douglas announced in Saskatchewan that the court's decision would be appealed to the Privy Council in London.

The Farm Security Act was among the legislation passed by Saskatchewan's C.C.F. Government at the first session of the Legislature after it took office in 1944.

It was referred to the Supreme Court last October for a ruling on only a chaste and silent expanse of moorland, running as far as they could penetrate a darkness to which they had become accustomed by now; a broad, rolling dark greyness of earth under a broad arching dark blueness of cloudy sky. Duke Of Windsor Returning To Britain

LONDON, May 13 (AP)—The Duke of Windsor, unemployed since he left the governorship of the Bahamas, will arrive in England Friday as a private citizen, more eager than ever, his acquaintances said today, to take a government job and aid his country in her current economic trouble.

The Duke and Duchess will arrive without fanfare aboard the Queen Elizabeth. Friends said they plan to stay several weeks, in all the privacy possible, at Charters, Sunninghill, the country estate of Mrs. Frank Parkinson, widow of a wealthy electrical goods manufacturer.

The Duke, when he abdicated 10 years ago, offered to serve his country in a government post. In unofficial quarters the feeling

now is being expressed that the Duke's long-time popularity with the British working man might fit him for a production job.

But government sources said that while it is quite possible Edward would confer with his brother, King George VI, and Prime Minister Attlee, there was no information now to suggest that a post would be made available.
