ISLANDER "GETS" FIRST GOTHA PLANE DOWNED IN FRANCE

Captain Wendell Rogers, Alberton, Won Military Cross by Bringing Down First Hun Gotha Plane in France.

Officer Commanding No. 1 Sqdn. R. F. C. congratulates the pilot who brought down the Gotha machine in flames—splendid. This must have been good work—Let me know the name of the pilot—General Tranehard.

This telegram from the general commanding the Royal Flying Corps in France, was handed to Capt. W. W. Rogers, of Alberton, by his C.O. on the afternoon of Dec. 12 last. A few hours later, Capt. Rogers received the following telegram, addressed to him—

"Congratulations on bringing down a Gotha Bri-Gen. Beck."

The story of the first Gotha to be brought down in France is told in the following letter, recently received by Capt. Wendell Rogers, R. F. C. No. 1 Sqdn. R. F. C. France, Dec. 14. "Well, dad, I had a great streak of luck day before yesterday. Shot down a Gotha in flames. Here is what happened: I was leading four other chaps and had just climbed through the clouds when I saw 17 Hun Gothas coming over to bomb us; so we climbed 'all out.' Two of our chaps left with engine trouble and things began to get a bit hot for the three of us when one Hun turned back, evidently with trouble in his port engine, as that propeller was turning over very slowly. Of course, I was after him like a streak. Got within 30 yards of him, behind and just under his tail, let him have 60 rounds, when he burst into flames. The old Hun glided down about 4000 feet, burning beautifully, and I went after him again, fearing he might be able to put the fire out; but before I got within striking distance he exploded, and, with the exception of one wing, there was not a piece bigger than my hand touched the ground.

This occurred over "no man's land," so my hopes for that piece of wing as a souvenir were shattered. We have a score to pay back to those blighters for some sleepless nights and their damage to London. . . . In all probability the crew were killed before the machine caught fire because all three were in a direct line with the petrol tank. We climbed again, but owing to the height they had over us we were unable to catch them, though we chased them six miles over the lines. . . .

A Gotha formation has been considered almost impregnable owing to their imposing size and the fact that each machine carries three guns; but this one took less "getting" than any Hun I have scrapped yet. . . . This is the first "Gotha" brought down in France, consequently the telegram of my C. O. from Gen. Trenchard, the G. O. Commanding the R. F. C. in France and the later message from Gen. Beck, my brigadier. . . . I am sending a picture of a Gotha. These machines have 100-foot wing span, while mine has only 20 feet. Also enclosed is a clipping from a London paper mentioning the incident.

Well, father, Blighty or Canada for me, soon, but I'd love to have another whack at these bombers first.
