THE regular monthly meeting of the School Board was held last evening. The Teachers' Reports showed the enrolment for the past month to be 1347—the average attendance 1133, and the percentage 88. There were 214 cases of tardiness, 6 cases of truancy, 4 cases of corporal punishment. The highest percentage of attendance made in any department was 97, the lowest 78. Miss James was granted leave of absence for the month of December, and Miss Mellish was appointed a substitute. It was agreed that the schools close for Christmas holidays on Tuesday, the 23rd inst., and re-open on Monday, Jan. 5th. Read a communication from City Council re the dismissal of J. M. Duncan. The Secretary was directed to acknowledge the receipt of the communication and intimate that the Board of Trustees would be happy to meet with His Worship and Councillors in the School Board office at any time that the Council may designate. After passing some bills the meeting adjourned.
