BAR HARBOR, Me., November 7.—The three months' stay here of the interned North German Lloyd line steamer Kronprinzessin Cecilie ended yesterday when conveyed by the United States destroyers Terry and Lamson, she started for Boston. The weather was fair, with a moderate breeze, and it was expected that the steamer would reach Boston late in the afternoon. The change in the port of internment was made because it was considered that the anchorage here would be dangerous during the winter storms.
