EARLY COLLEGE CLOSING.—The closing of St. Dunstan's University will take place on May 15. The Board of Governor's decided on this date in order to permit the young men of the University to go home on the farms to take part in the greater production movement.

A GOOD MOVE.—The large lot and collar on Haviland street, nearly opposite the Charlottetown Hospital, is being filled in and put in shape for cultivation. This is a move in the right direction, and it would be a good idea if all the other vacant lots about the city could be so utilized.

GET YOUR SKATES.—The Arena Rink will be open Thursday and Friday evenings 25th and 26th inst., from 7 to 8 o'clock. Parties having skates checked please call for same as management after these dates will not assume responsibility for skates left over.

A NEW CHURCH.—Plans for a new Catholic church at East Point in this Province have been made by Messrs. C. B. Champell & Hunter, architects. The work of quarrying the stone and building the basement will be a structure measuring 140 x 17 feet.

RAILWAY OFFICIALS VISIT.—Mr. G. A. Hayes, General Manager of Canadian Government Railways, Mr. L. S. Brown, General Superintendent, and the other railway officials who arrived at Port Borden on Monday went to Tignish yesterday. They will probably come to Charlottetown today.

ST. DUNSTAN'S CATHEDRAL.—It is proposed to proceed with the work of the interior finish of St. Dunstan's Cathedral during the course of the coming summer. The work to be done consists of the metal lathing, interior steel construction, plain plastering, ornamental plastering and marbleizing. This work will be under the charge of Mr. M. Vincent, of New York, who did the marbleizing work of the former edition.

THE MARKET.—Owing to the very bad state of the roads the local market yesterday was the smallest for some time. Some eggs were retailing from 38 to 40c per dozen, butter at 50 cents and fowl from \$1.00 to \$1.25 each. Buyers report that eggs are in fair demand. They are paying 34 cents per dozen. Very little dairy butter is offering and there is a very limited demand for it owing to the fact that margarine is being largely used in centres like Sydney and Halifax, where there used to be a big demand for dairy butter. Creamery is in fair supply. The potato market is very quiet just now and dealers are anxiously waiting for the United States market to open as the Upper Province markets are at present well supplied. Groceries in general remain unchanged in price. Flour is steady but feeds are very scarce.

LONDON, April 22—The appointment of Viscount Milner to the War Secretaryship, it is considered, will make for efficiency as he is rated by many as the strongest member of the War Cabinet. Personally he is not among the popular politicians because he is extremely Conservative in his views, and the Liberals always

have condemned his South African policy. The Earl of Derby has a general popular personality which induces the view that he will fit well into the job. The selection of Mr. Chamberlain does not seem likely to be greeted with unanimous enthusiasm. The Daily Mail, for instance, yesterday said such action would be trifling with the nation. It described Mr. Chamberlain as an honest mediocrity who owed his advancement entirely to the prestige of his father, the late Joseph Chamberlain.
