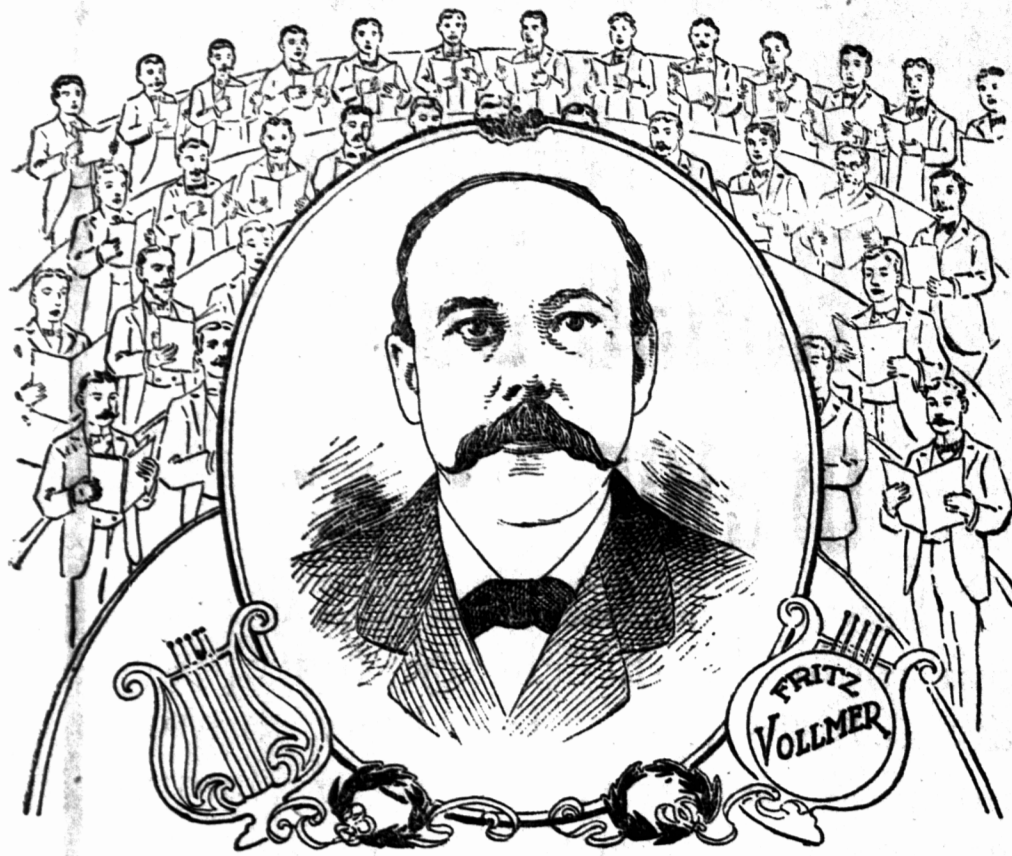


A GREAT SINGER'S NARROW ESCAPE.

The house was vacant at the time, and the fire is supposed to be the work of an incendiary. Mrs. Haggan, formerly Mrs. McEwen, had been married recently, and had moved to her new home in Graham's Road leaving part of her furniture in the old house.

SUMMERSIDE citizens and the Province generally, will be pleased to learn that the Dominion Government, have decided to provide a medical inspector on the S. S. Northumberland to prevent the smallpox from spreading to this Province. While in Charlottetown on Thursday Hon. R. C. McLeod, held a conference with Premier Farquharson in urging that the Dominion Government provide an inspector between Summerside at Point du Chene and yesterday afternoon Mr. McLeod received the following telegram: "Dominion Government offers to appoint a doctor to watch boat from Pt. du Chene to Summerside." THE GUARDIAN understands that Dr. J. H. McLeellan, health officer of the town has accepted the position and will make his first trip and inspection today.

A MEETING of the Board of Health was held in the Council Chamber last night for the purpose of taking steps toward the prevention of smallpox. Those present were Mayor McNeill, Chairman, Councilors Morris, Dickieson, Goss and Waugh. After the different members took the oath of office Mr. H. J. Massy was appointed clerk and Messrs Morris, Dickieson and Rogers special committee. The chairman mentioned that Mr. Wm. Small had offered his late dwelling for an hospital at \$2.50 per month with the understanding that in event of a case of smallpox being placed there the town purchased the building at a cost of \$300. Mr. Goss was pleased that he had a place in view superior to the old one on Seaweed Road which was surrounded by a swamp and undesirable for sick patients. He moved that the committee accept Mr. Small's offer, and that the necessary arrangements be made for having the place fitted up at once. The motion was seconded by Mr. Waugh and carried. It was mentioned that a number of ladies were collecting for an hospital and it was decided that the committee see them, and have any donations such as furniture, bedding, etc. placed in readiness at the earliest opportunity, the same to be returned if not used. A letter from the secretary of the Souris Board of Trade was read asking for the Board's cooperation in using precautionary measures against the smallpox.

CITY AND COUNTRY

TELEPHONIC advices received last night from Georgetown stated that there is practically nothing new in regard to the condition of the seaman on board the schooner Monarch whose illness is accompanied with symptoms of smallpox. During the day Dr. Allen of Cardigan accompanied Dr. Stewart on board the schooner and visited the cabin where the patient is quarantined. Dr. Stewart is of the opinion that it will be impossible to tell whether it is smallpox until tomorrow. The patient in addition to smallpox symptoms, pain in the back and head, has developed symptoms of measles. The symptoms of measles, however, are not strong enough to indicate that he is suffering from that disease. It is understood that the residents of Georgetown if smallpox develops on-board the schooner will not allow the patient to land and in consequence the schooner will be sent to Pictou with the patient as the schooner belongs to Nova Scotia. As far as THE GUARDIAN could learn last night the probability of the seaman developing smallpox is weakening.
