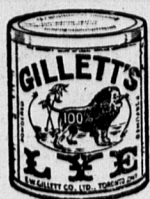

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

DANIEL IN THE LION'S DEN

Dan. 6: 10-23 GOLDEN TEXT

"The angel of the Lord encampeth round about them that fear him; and delivereth them."—Ps. 34: 7.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

Those whose privilege it was to arrange the series of lessons for this month saved their faces by placing the story of Daniel in the Lion's Den in it. Any lesson from the book of Daniel with this one left out would have brought upon them swift condemnation. It has been the inspiration of untold thousands in the past. It remains to thrill and fire to heroism of the highest quality untold thousands more.

Daniel had to wait many years for a crisis to come upon him like that which overtook his companions upon the plains of Dura. But jealousy against him did not sleep through any opportunity, and it was wide awake to work the one it forged to the full. And Daniel let it. Innocency has nothing to hide nor has it anything to fear. It fears nothing but sin.

Accordingly, when the trap was set to catch Daniel in that which concerned the law of his God he was easily caught. The real snare was that in which the vain king found himself when he consented to make a decree which would place a hedge of divine prerogative about his kingly rights. He suffered more over the result a great deal than Daniel.

The companions of Daniel proved true to their God, as the last lesson showed. In this one it is made evident that Daniel was not only true to God, he was also true to his habit of devotion. He did not, as Tom Brown confessed he had done, change his manner in the time or the attitude of his prayer through fear. The girl who misread the words "excellent spirit" and read that there was an "excellent spine" in Daniel made a mistake that is suggestive of his splendid quality.

Possibly the lesson to be taken from this most interesting narrative above all others is that which teaches the value of having stated times and places for devotion. Those who esteem the mercy of God so great that they can afford to make any place their place of praise and supplication run the great risk of praying at no time and of finding that no spot becomes hallowed. Let some place become precious by reason of the fact that God is met there and let some stated times of each day be the spiritual spring-board for all the other hours.

The world cares for and misses the good man. It may be supposed that Darius thought little of Daniel's creed, but he unquestionably thought a great deal of the man whose character proved that he had one, goodness counts, and it compels, too, some respect for the God which goodness worships. The king said unto Daniel: "Thy God, whom thou servest continually, is able to deliver thee."

Let the lions which failed to feast on Daniel stand for such other terrors which the Divine might muzzles as you will. God has power to stop the mouths of lions. He is the same yesterday, to-day and forever.

Daniel gives as a reason for his deliverance that innocency was found in him. Alas, that boys and girls ever dare to have the innocency with which they prayed at the knees of their mothers broken! Alas, that evil is searched out and followed rather than that the bloom of early piety retained! Innocency—it is the flower of God, and it is the strongest element in the choicest manliness.

Branch Line Clifton Bridge to Stanley Bridge.

Notice to Contractors. Sealed Tenders addressed to the undersigned and endorsed "Tenders for branch line Clifton Bridge to Stanley Bridge," will be received at this office until sixteen o'clock on Wednesday, the 20th, September, 1911 for the construction of a branch line railway about 1 1/2 miles and three-quarter miles in length from Clifton Highway Bridge to Stanley Bridge, Prince Edward Island.

Plans, profiles, specifications and form of contract to be entered into can be seen on and after the 14th, September at the office of the Chief Engineer of the Department of Railways and Canals, Ottawa; at the office of the Chief Engineer of the Intercolonial Railway, Montreal; and at the office of Superintendent of the Prince Edward Island Railway, Charlottetown, P. E. I., at which places forms of tender may be obtained.

Parties tendering will be required to accept the fair wages schedule prepared or to be prepared by the Department of Labor which schedule will form part of the contract. Contractors are requested to bear in mind that tenders will not be considered unless made strictly in accordance with the printed form, and in the case of firms, unless there are attached the actual signature, the nature of the occupation, and place of residence of each member of the firm.

An accepted bank cheque for the sum of \$10,000 made payable to the order of the Minister of Railways and Canals must accompany each tender, which sum will be forfeited if the party tendering declines entering into contract for the work, at the rates stated in the offer submitted.

The cheque thus sent in will be returned to the respective contractors whose tenders are not accepted.

The cheque of the successful tenderer will be held as security, of part security, for the due fulfillment of the contract to be entered into.
