SEEK REDUCTION IN ELECTRIC POWER RATES TRURO, N. S., Aug. 22 - (CP) - The Union of Nova Scotia Municipalities, meeting in the final session of its 41st annual conference, today passed a number of resolutions ranging from requests for reduction in electric power costs to the need for an adequate police patrol on highways. The union decided to ask the provincial government to review the recommendation of the Dawson report for the purpose of formulating a policy under which the average cost of electric power to the consumer would be reduced. This, it was felt, would encourage the expansion of industry in Nova Scotia.
