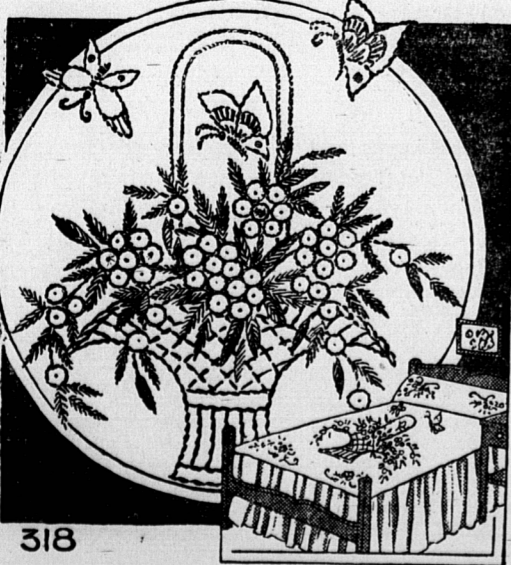

Dorothy Dix's Letter Box

DOROTHY DIX SAYS — AGE IS IMPORTANT FACTOR IN KEEPING MARRIAGE HAPPY Invariably Trouble Follows When There Is Great Difference in Years Between Husband and Wife

Age is one of the most important factors in making or marring a marriage. Whether we realize it or not, time does set its mark upon us and determines, to a large extent, our characteristics and whether we are able to adopt ourselves to our mates. Hence it is no wonder we have a never-ending discussion about whether the bride or the groom shall be the elder, about whether there is a greater chance of happiness if men and women of approximately the same age marry, and whether the best bet is for the husband to be many years older than the wife. Of course, there is no definite answer to any of these questions, because marriage is one of the things to which there are a million exceptions to every rule. We have all seen so many marriages that flouted all of the chronological theories and that turned out both happily and unhappily that it leaves us guessing as to when is the auspicious time for a couple to enter the holy estate.

There is, for instance, a general consensus that the husband should be older than the wife, when a woman takes a boy husband we prophesy dire consequences.

We point out that when a woman is older than her husband she cannot, for the life of her, keep from bossing him. She always feels that he is a little boy whom she has taken to bring up, and that Mama always knows best.

We also point out that women age faster than men and that the older wife will be on old woman while her husband is in the prime of life. Furthermore, no old wife can keep from being jealous of younger and prettier women, and when she sees her young boy being around with girls of his own age she is subject to attacks of green eye that do not make for congenial peace and bliss.

All of this is true, yet many marriages in which the wife has been virtually a cradle-snatcher are notably successful. In such cases the husband is mentally mature and so is more congenial with a woman older than he is than he is with a light young girl.

Or else he is a man with a mother complex who never really wants a wife at all. He wants a mother to pet him and baby him and assume all of the responsibilities, and he doesn't in the least mind being told what to do. He has always worn a woman's collar around his neck and he feels lost without one.

Most of us have thought that the ideal difference in age between a husband and wife was from two to ten years older than the wife. This puts them in the same age class, with the same background, habits, tastes and points of view, and, according to the best of the matrimonial deponents, this should make it easy for them to get along together.

Apparently, however, it doesn't. In fact, the quarrelling youngsters who keep the divorce mills busy, which may doubtless be spoiled traits and that neither one of them is old enough nor has had enough experience of living, to have what to do. A famous sociologist, who has been making a profound study of the husband and wife age problem, asserts that the happiest marriages are those in which the husband is fifteen, thirty, or even more years older than his wife. He says that the old husband assumes a maternal attitude toward his wife and she returns this by a confident daughterly affection, and that this practically always results in great

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THE COOK'S CORNER

TRIFLE

Oake or macaroon crumbs, or ladyfingers
Canned strawberries
Custard sauce
Whipped cream, if desired
Method: Arrange crumbs in the bottom of sherbet glasses. Pour over them the juice from the strawberries. Let stand for about 1 hour. Then mix several of the strawberries into each serving. Chill well and serve with custard sauce garnished with whipped cream, if desired.

CUSTARD SAUCE

1 cup milk
2 eggs
2 tablespoons sugar
1-8 teaspoon salt
1-2 teaspoon vanilla
Method: Scald the milk. Beat the egg yolks slightly with the sugar and salt and add gradually to the scalded milk, stirring constantly. Cook over hot water for about 5 minutes, or until the mixture coats a spoon. Remove from the heat and fold in the egg whites that have been beaten until stiff. Fold until the mixture is smooth. Add the flavoring and chill well.
