SAN TON BREAKS AMHERST TRACK RECORD

Paces Fast Heat Of Free-For-All In 2.08; Uscita Britton & Scotty Watson Winners

AMHERST, N.S., Aug. 20—(CP)—Footing the fastest mile recorded on Nova Scotia harness racing tracks this season, San Ton Halifax horse driven by Johnny Conroy, took the first heat of the free-for-all in 2:08 minutes here this afternoon and won the event in three straight heats.

In the 2:27 Trot and Pace, Scotty Watson trailed a poor fifth in the first heat, coming back to nose out Little Fox and Hal Boolum for premier honors in the last two.

Uscita Britton also staged a comeback, jumping from third place in the first heat to beat out Major Bowes and Albert E. Gratian for first money.

Detroit Tigers Beat Yanks 1-0 In Ten Innings

DETROIT, Aug. 20—(AP)—The veteran Tommy Bridges outpitched Ernie Bonham in a 10-inning thriller today as the Tigers nosed out the Yankees 1-0 to take the rubber game of the three-game American League series.

Bridges, hurling one of the finest games of his career, limited the Bombers to two hits and fanned nine. Charlie Keller singled in the first inning for the only clean blow off the team right-hander, Johnny Evers' single in the sixth was of the infield variety.

The Yanks were playing without Joe DiMaggio, who suffered a sprained ankle in yesterday's contest.

At Chicago, the White Sox' precision pitching carried the second place Chicagoans to their third straight shutout victory, one shy of a league record, and their ninth consecutive victory as Johnny Rigney blanked Philadelphia Athletics 9-0 on three scattered singles.

The triumph gave the Sox a three-game sweep of the series and 18 victories in their last 21 games.

At Cleveland, the fourth-place Indians kept spiraling downward losing their seventh straight game as Senators topped them 6-3.

At St. Louis, Johnny Berardino laid down a perfect square bunt, scoring Roy Cullenbine from third, to give the Browns a 4-3 victory in the 10th inning and a sweep of a league doubleheader with Boston Red Sox today. The Browns won the first game 11-9.

OTTAWA, Aug. 19—(CP)—Three representatives of French Canada today sent messages of comfort and news of the Dominion's war effort to the peoples of occupied and unoccupied France.

They were Maj.-Gen. L. R. LaFleche, Deputy Minister of National War Services; L. de Montigny, Director of the Senate Translation Services; and Mme. Marthe Simard, wife of Prof. Andre Simard of Laval University, Quebec.

Gen. LaFleche, who at first hand saw France crumble before the German advance, recalled to the people of France the affection, blood and common ideals which unite them with Canada and which are forever evident at Vimy Ridge.
