That winter Mr. Myers was one of the ice-boat crew that crossed to Tormentine. On one occasion with the mercury thermometer below zero the island crew left Cape Traverse, then the island terminal. A bitter snow storm came up and the men were lost but after fighting the elements for over fourteen hours succeeded in reaching Cape Tormentine. Their faces and hands were frozen and they were almost exhausted. It was four days before they were able to return to the island. Other members of that ice boat crew who still remember that winter were Arthur Campbell, Burpee MacMicken, Russell Bell and Thomas Carruthers of Summerside. Mr. Myers who worked with the ice boats for eighteen winters, does not seem to be any the worse of these bitter experiences and while he likes to reminisce of those days he prefers now the modern method of travelling in a well-heated car - A.
