### Held Last Night With Good Attendance—Association in Very Prosperous Condition—Interesting Communications Read By Secretary.

The annual meeting of the Provincial Rifle Association was held last evening. There was a good attendance. Colonel H. M. Davison acted as chairman in the absence of the President, Colonel F. S. Moore. The annual report and financial report of the past year were read by the Secretary, Colonel C. Leigh, and adopted, these showing that the Association is in a very prosperous condition. The Secretary read various communications of interest to the riflemen, the principal being the new rule permitting each province to send sixteen representatives to the Ottawa shoot only four of which are required to be tyros. The new rule regarding the London Merchants team gives this Province a better chance than formerly as the team must be picked from sixteen men nominated by each province previous to the opening of the Ottawa shoot.

It was good news for the riflemen in the dispatch that the peep sight is being manufactured and will be available for the annual matches. New targets will be used this year the principal change being a smaller "Bull" at 200 yds. It will be 6 inches in diameter instead of 8 and 18 inches at 500 and 600 yards instead of 20. This is done to counterbalance the great scores expected with the new "peep" which is being made at the former "Sutherland Sight" works, New Glasgow, N. S. The Inter-Maritime shoot will be held in Charlottetown June 12th and a committee of Colonel D. A. McKinnon, Captain J. A. Moore and Mr. G. M. Moore were appointed to select the team and arrange practices, etc.

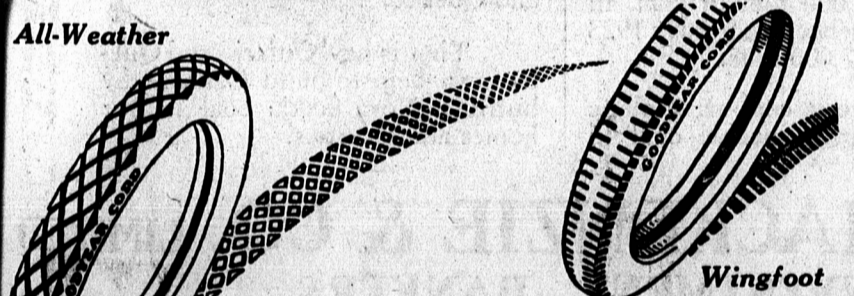
