CHRISTMAS MENUS OF C.N.R.

MONTREAL, Dec. 20 — Fifty thousand pounds of turkey and three and a half tons of plum pudding will be served to patrons of Canadian National Railways dining cars, cafe cars and station restaurants over the Christmas and New Year season, according to W.W. Swindon, manager sleeping and dining car department. The Christmas pudding was made in the kitchen of a Canadian National Railways commissary car by Fred Conway, chief-instructor. Housewives have always been interested in the recipe used, principal items in the three and a half ton pudding, were 1,500 lbs. of raisins, 950 pounds of currants, 480 pounds of mixed peel, 370 lbs. of mixed fruit, 225 lbs. of suet, 90 dozen eggs, 10 pounds of ground nutmeg, 12 pounds mace and 20 pounds each of ground all-spice, cinnamon and ginger.
