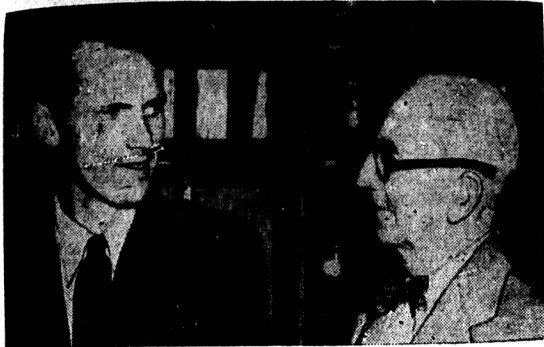


Found First A-Bomb Step
