**IN MEMORIAM**

**MRS. EDITH SPURR MUIR**

**NEW GLASGOW** — Word has been received here by E.W. Spurr, retired bank manager, of the death in Dundee, Scotland, of his only sister, Mrs. Edith Spurr Muir. The word came through by transoceanic telephone from Scotland to New York and overland to Nova Scotia.

Mrs. Muir was attending the Baptist Assembly of Scotland at Aberdeen when she was suddenly stricken and died a few hours later.

Born in Port Morien, Cape Breton, the only daughter of the late Rev. J.C. Spurr, she attended Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, and Acadia University, from which she graduated with honors in 1907, and obtained her Master of Arts Degree in 1908.

Following graduation she taught foreign languages for a number of years at Peller Institute, Grand Ligne, Quebec; at Antier and Estevan, Saskatchewan; and finally at the Duke of Connaught High School, New Westminster, B.C.

In 1920 she married at Hantsport, N.S., James Thomson Muir, a native of Dundee, Scotland.

They lived for four years in Winnipeg and then moved to Dundee, Scotland, where Mr. Muir has since carried on a business as a manufacturing chemist and wholesaler of Bakers' supplies.

In addition to her husband and her brother, E.W. Spurr, New Glasgow, N.S., Mrs. Muir is survived in her immediate family by a half-brother, W.J. Lockhart, K.C., of Estevan, Saskatchewan, for many
